DECREE OF THE PRESIDENT OF THE RUSSIAN FEDERATION NO. 312 OF MARCH 27, 1992

ON CONTROL OF THE EXPORT OF NUCLEAR MATERIAL, EQUIPMENT AND TECHNOLOGY FROM THE RUSSIAN FEDERATION (with the Amendments and Additions of May 6, 2000)

<u>Decree</u> of the President of the Russian Federation No. 822 of May 6, 2000 amended this Decree See the previous text of the Decree

In order to intensify control of exports of nuclear materials, equipment and technologies from the Russian Federation, I resolve:

To decree that nuclear materials, as well as technologies, equipment, installations and special non-nuclear materials for their processing, use or production may be exported to any state which does not possess nuclear weapons only if the entire nuclear activity of this state is guaranteed by the International Atomic Energy Agency.

In exceptional cases such export from the Russian Federation to a state possessing no nuclear weapons and which had not placed its nuclear activities under guarantees of the International Agency for Nuclear Energy can be carried out pursuant to individual decisions of the Government of the Russian Federation, subject to the following conditions:

the planned deliveries will not contradict with international obligations of the Russian Federation;

the recipient government will provide official assurance that the delivered materials, equipment and technologies will not be used in possible development of a nuclear explosive device;

the delivery will be effected solely to ensure safe operation of nuclear plants existing on the territory of the recipient state;

guarantees of the International Agency for Nuclear Energy shall be applicable to such plants.

Government of the Russian Federation may establish additional preconditions required to carry out such export.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Russian Federation shall make a corresponding statement on this question.

<u>Regulations</u> on the export and import of nuclear materials, equipment, special non-nuclear materials and corresponding technologies were approved by <u>Decision</u> of the Government of the Russian Federation No. 973 of December 15, 2000
