## AN ACT <br> TO AMEND THE CUSTOMS AND EXCISE ACT

[10th November, 1999]
BE IT ENACTED by the King and Legislative Assembly of Tonga in the Legislature of the Kingdom as follows:-

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the Customs and Excise (Amendment) Act 1999.
(2) The Customs and Excise Act (Cap. 67), as amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.
2. The Principal Act is amended by deleting Schedule 1 and substituted by the following:

## 'SCHEDULE 1 <br> PART 1

## TONGA HARMONIZED CUSTOMS TARIFF AND EXCISE

SCHEDULE

1. This Schedule embodies a classification of goods for import and goods for export for both tariff and statistical purposes. The Tariff set out in the schedule is based on the International Convention on the Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding system established by the Convention for the classification of goods in Customs Tariff signed in Brussels on the 14 June, 1983 and shall be interpreted and applied in accordance with the Interpretative Rules and Additional Rules and the Explanatory Notes to the Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding System.
2. For the purposes of classification of all imported goods an international system has been used, designated Harmonized System Nomenclature (hereinafter referred to as the HS) published by the Customs Co-operation Counil in Brussels. In this Schedule, the HS is fully reproduced at the four(4) digit heading level. The first and second digits indicating the Chapter number and the third and fourth digits the numerical order in which the heading appears within the Chapter. The fifth and sixth digits (Sub-heading level) of the HS have been completely or partially used, except where none of the sub-heading have been used, in this instance the fifth and sixth digits have been replaced with 00 . Additions and extensions at the national or at the Pacific region level are represented by a split in the tariff item at the seventh and/or eighth digits.
3. Where it is not necessary to subdivide a heading for differential rates of duty or for other purposes, the complete wording of the HS heading has been reproduced as a Tariff Item, the heading number being supplemented by the addition of four zeros. Thus the first four digits of a Tariff Item number correspond at all times to the HS heading number.
4. Goods shall be classified according to the terms of Section and Chapter notes and the terms of the chapter headings
In Cases of doubt about the classification of any items reference shall be made to Brussels Harmonized Nomenclature, together with the Explanatory Notes and Classification Opinions, therefor, as amended from time to time.

## GENERAL RULES FOR THE INTERPRETATION OF THE

## HARMONIZED SYSTEM

Classification of goods in the Nomenclature shall be governed by the following principles:

1. The titles of Sections, Chapters and Sub chapters are provided for ease of reference only; for legal purposes, classification shall be determined according to the terms of the heading and any relatives Section or Chapter Notes and, provided such headings or Notes do not otherwise require, according to the following provisions.
2. (a) Any reference in a heading to an article shall be taken to include a reference to that article incomplete or unfinished, provided that, as presented, the incomplete or unfinished article has the essential character of the complete or finished article. It shall also be taken to include a reference to that article complete or finished (or falling to be classification as complete or finished by virtue of this Rule), presented unassembled or disassembled.
(b) Any reference in a heading to a material or substance shall be taken to include a reference to mixtures or combinations of that material or substance with other materials or substances. Any reference to goods of a given material or substance shall be taken to include a reference to goods consisting wholly or partly of such material or substance. The classification of goods consisting of more than one material or substance shall be according to the principles of Rule 3.
3. When by application of Rules 2 (b) or for any other reason, goods are prima facie, classifiable under two or more headings, classsification shall be effected as follows:
(a) The heading which provides the most specific description shall be preferred to headings providing a more general description. However, when two or more headings each refer to part only of the materials or substances contained in mixed or composite goods or to part only of the items in a set put up for retail sale, those headings are to be regarded as equally specific in relation to those goods, even if one of them gives a more complete or precise description of the goods.
(b) Mixtures, composite goods consisting of different materials or made up of different components, and goods put up in sets for retail sale which cannot be classified by reference to 3 (a), shall be classified as if they consisted of the material or component which gives them their essential character, insofar as this criterion is applicable.
(c) When goods cannot be classified by reference to 3 (a) or 3 (b), they shall be classified under the heading which occurs last in numerical order among those which equally merit consideration.
4. Goods which cannot be classified in accordance with the above Rule shall be classified under the heading appropriate to the goods which they are most akin.
5. In addition to the foregoing provisions, the following Rules shall apply in respect of the goods referred to therein:
(a) Camera cases, musical instrument cases, gun cases, drawing instrument cases, necklace cases and similar containers, specially shaped or fitted to contain specific article or set of articles, suitable for long-term use and presented with the articles for which they are intended, shall be classified with such articles when of a kind normally sold therewith. The Rule does not, however, apply to containers which give the whole its essential character:
(b) Subject to the provision of Rule 5(a) above, packing materials and packing containers presented with the goods there in shall be classified with the goods if they are of a kind normally used for packing such goods. However, this provision does not apply when such packing materials or packing containers are clearly suitable for repetitive use
6. For legal purpose, the classification of goods in the subheadings of a heading shall be determined according to the terms of those subheadings and any related Subheading Notes and, mutatis mutandis, to the above Rules, on the understanding that only sub headings at the same level are comparable. For the purposes of the Rule the relative Section and Chapter Notes also apply, unless the context otherwise requires.

(b) Mixtures of two or more isomers of the same organic compound (whether or not containing impurities), except mixtures of acyclic hydrocarbon isomers (other than stereoisomers), whether or not saturated (Chapter 27);
( c ) The products of headings Nos. 29.36 to 29.39 or the sugar ethers and sugar esters, and their salts, of heading No. 29.40, or the products of heading No. 29.41, whether or not chemically defined;
(d) The products mentioned in (a), (b) or (c) above dissolved in water;
(e) The products mentioned in (a), (b) or (c) above dissolved in other solvents provided that the solution constitutes a normal and necessary method of putting up these products adopted solely for reasons of safety or for transport and that the solvent does not render the product particularly suitable for specific use rather than for general use;
( f ) The products mentioned in (a), (b), (c), (d) or (e) above with an added stabiliser necessary for their preservation or transport;
( g ) The products mentioned in (a), (b), (c), (d), (e) or (f) above with an added anti-dusting agent or a colouring or odoriferous substance added to facilitate their identification or for safety reasons, provided that the additions do not render the product particularly suitable for specific use rather than for general use;
(h) The following products, diluted to standard strengths, for the production of azo dyes: diazonium salts, couplers used for these slats and diazetisable amines and their salts.
2. This Chapter does not cover:
( a ) Goods of heading No. 15.04 or glycerol (heading No. 15.20);
( b ) Ethyl alcohol (heading No. 22.07 or 22.08);
( c ) Methane or propane (heading No. 27.11);
(d) The compounds of carbon mentioned in Note 2 to Chapter 28;
(e) Urea (heading No. 31.02 or 31.05);
(f) Colouring matter or vegetable or animal origin (heading No. 32.03), synthetic organic colouring matter, synthetic organic products of a kind used as fluorescent brightening agents or as luminophores (heading No. 32.04) or dyes or other colouring matter put up in forms or packings for retail sale (heading No. 32.12).
( g ) Enzymes (heading No. 35.07);
(h) Metaldehyde hexamethylenetetramine or similar substances, put up in forms (for example, tablets, sticks or similar forms) for use as fuels, or liquid or liquefied-gas fuels in containers of a kind use for filling or refilling cigarette or similar lighters and of a capacity not exceeding $300 \mathrm{~cm}^{3} \quad$ (heading No. 36.06);
( i j ) Products put up as charges for fire-extinguishers or put up in fire-extinguishing grenades, of heading No. 38.13; ink removers put up in packings for retail sale, of heading No. 38.23; or
(k) Optical elements, for example, of ethylenediamine tartrate (heading No. 90.01).
3. Goods which could be included in two or more of the headings of this Chapter are to be classified in that one of those headings which occurs lasting in numerical order.
4. In headings Nos. 29.04 to 29.06, 29.08 to 29.11 and 29.13 to 29.20 , any reference to halogenated, sulphonated, nitrated or nitrosated derivatives includes a reference to compound derivatives, such as sulphohalogenated, nitrohalogenated, nitrodulphonated or nitrosulphohalogenated derivatives.

Nitro or nitroso groups are not to be taken as "nitrogen-functions" for the purposes of heading No. 29.29.

For the purposes of headings Nos. 29.11, 29.12, 29.14, 29.18 and 29.22, "oxygenfunction" is to be restricted to the functions (the characteristic organic oxygen containing groups) referred to in headings Nos. 29.05 to 29.20 .
5. (a) The esters of acid-function organic compounds of sub-Chapters I to VII with organic compounds of these sub-Chapters are to be classified with that compound which is classified in the heading which occurs last in numerical order in these sub Chapters.

(a) Liquids and pastes (including latex, whether or not pre-vulcanised, and other dispersions and solutions);
(b) Blocks of irregular shape, lumps, bales, powders, granules, crumbs and similar bulk forms.
4. In Note 1 to this Chapter and in heading No. 40.02, the expression "synthetic rubber" applies to:
(a) Unsaturated synthetic substances which can be irreversibly transformed by vulcanisation with sulphur into non-thermoplastic substances which, at a temperature between 18 and 29 degrees, will not break on being extended to three times their original length and will return, after being extended

(c ) Printed parts of books or booklets, in the form of assembled or separate sheets or signature, constituting the whole or a part of a complete work and designed for binding. However, printed Pictures or illustrations not bearing a text, whether in the form of signatures or separate sheets, fall in heading No. 49.11.
5. 12. For the purposes of this Section, the expression "polyamides" includes "aramids".
13. Unless the context otherwise requires, textile garments of different headings are to be classified in their own headings even if put up in sets for retail sale.

## Subheading Notes.

1. In this Section and, where applicable, throughout the Nomenclature, the following expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them:
( a ) Elastomeric yarn
Filament yarn, including monofilament, of synthetic textile material, other than textured yarn, which does not break on being extended to three times its original length and which returns, after being extended to twice its original length, within a period of five minutes, to a length not greater than one and a half times its original length.
( b ) Unbleached yarn

3. Headings Nos. 56.02 and 56.03 cover respectively felt and nonwovens impregnated, coated, covered or laminated with plastics or rubber whatever the nature of these materials (compact or cellular). Heading No. 56.03 also includes nonwovens in which plastics or rubber forms the bonding substance. Headings Nos. 56.02 and 56.03 do not, however, cover:
(a) Felt impregnated, coated, covered or laminated with plastics or rubber containing $50 \%$ or less by weight of textile material or felt completely embedded m plastics or rubber (Chapter 39 or 40);
( b ) Nonwovens, either completely embedded in plastics or rubber, or entirely coated or covered on both sides with such materials, provided that such coating or covering can be seen with the naked eye with no account being taken of any resulting change of colour (Chapter 39 or 40); or

If several separate components to cover the lower part of the body are presented together (for example, trousers and shorts, or a skirt or divided skirt and trousers), the constituent lower part shall be the trousers, or, in the case of women's or girls' suits, the skirt or divided skirt, the other garments being considered separately. The term "suit" includes the following sets of garments, whether or not they fulfil all the above conditions:
- morning dress, comprising a plain jacket (cutaway) with rounded tails
at the back anging well down
at at the back and striped trousers;
- evening dress (tailcoat), generally made of black fabric, the jacket of which is relatively short at the front, does not close and has narrow skirts cut in at the hips and hanging down behind;
- dinner jacket suits, in which the jacket is similar in s tyle to an ordinary jacket (though perhaps revealing more of the shirt front),
(b) The term "ensemble" means a set of garments (other than suits and articles of heading No. 61.07, 61.08 or 61.09), composed of several pieces made up in identical fabric, put up for retail sale, and comprising:
- one garment designed to cover the upper part of the body, with the exception of pullovers which may form a second upper grament in the sole context of twin sets, and of waistcoats which may also form a second upper garment, and
- one or two different garments, designed to cover the lower part of the body and consisting of trousers, bib and brace overalls, breeches, shorts (other than swimwear), a skirt or a divided skirt.
All of the components of an ensemble must be of the same fabric construction, style, colour and composition; they also must be of corresponding or compatible size. The term "ensemble" does not apply to track suits or ski suits, of heading No. 61.12 .

4. Headings Nos. 61.05 and 61.06 do not cover garments with pockets below the waist, with a ribbed waistband or other means of tightening at the bottom of the garment, or garments having an average of less than 10 stitches per linear centimetre in each direction counted on an area measuring at least $10 \mathrm{~cm} \times 10 \mathrm{~cm}$. Heading No. 61.05 does not cover sleeveless garments.

All the components of a "ski ensemble" must be made up in a fabric of the same texture style and composition whether or not of the same colour; they also must be of corresponding or compatible size.

7. Garments which are, prima facie classifiable both in heading No. 61.13 and in other headings of this Chapter, excluding heading No. 61.11, are to be classified in heading No. 61.13.

(b) The term "ensemble" means a set of garments (other than suits and articles of heading No. 62.07 or

All the components of a "ski ensemble" must be made up in a fabric of the same texture, style and composition whether or not of the same colour; they also must be of corresponding or compatible size.

7. Scarves and articles of the scarf type, square or approximately square, of which no side exceeds 60 cm , are to be classified as handkerchiefs (heading No. 62.13) Handkerchiefs of which any side exceeds 60 cm are to be classified in heading No. 62.14.
8. Articles of this Chapter which cannot be identified as either men's or boys garments or as women's or girls' garments are to be classified in the headings concerning women's or girls garments.
9. Articles of this Chapter may be made of metal thread

(a) Of natural or cultured pearls or of precious or semi-precious stones (natural, synthetic or reconstructed), or
(b) Of precious metal or of metal clad with precious metal, are to be classified in this Chapter.
2. (a) Heading Nos. $71.13,71.14$ and 71.15 do not cover articles in which precious metal or metal clad with precious metal is present as minor constituents only, such as minor fittings or minor ornamentation (for example, monograms, ferrules and rims), and paragraph (b) of the foregoing Note does not apply to such articles(*).
(*)The underline portion of this Note constitutes an optional text.
(b) Heading No. 71.16 does not cover articles containing precious metal or metal clad with precious metal (other than as minor constituents).
3. This Chapter does not cover:
(a) Amalgams of precious metal, or colloidal precious metal (heading No. 28.43);
(b) Sterile surgical suture materials, dental fillings or other goods of Chapter 30;
(c) Articles of Chapter 32 (for example, lustres);
(d) Handbags or other articles of heading No. 42.02 or articles of heading No. 42.03;
(e) Articles of heading No. 43.03 or 43.04 ;
(f) Goods of Section XI (textiles and textile articles);
(g) Footwear, headgear or other articles of Chapter 64 or 65 ;
(h) Umbrellas, walking-sticks or other articles of Chapter 66

(k) Articles of Chapter 90, 91 or 92 (scientific instruments, clocks and watches, musical instruments);
(1) Arms or parts thereof (Chapter 93);
(m) Articles covered by Note 2 to Chapter 95;
(n) Articles of Chapter 96 other than those of headings Nos. 96.01 to 96.06 or 96.15; or
(o) Original sculptures or statuary (heading No. 97.03), collectors' pieces (heading No. 97.05) or antiques of an age exceeding one hundred years (heading No. 97.06), other than natural or cultured pearls or precious or semi-precious stones.
4. (a) The expression "precious metal" means silver, gold and platinum.
(b) The expression "platinum" means platinum, iridium, osmium, palladium, rhodium and ruthenium.
(c) The expression "precious or semi-precious stones" does not include any of the substances specified in Note 2(b) to Chapter 96.
5. For the purposes of this Chapter, any alloy (including a sintered mixture and an inter-metallic compound) containing precious metal is to be treated as an alloy of precious metal if any one precious metal constitutes as much as $2 \%$, by weight, of the alloy. Alloys of precious metal are to be classified according to the following rules:
(a) An alloy containing $2 \%$ or more, by weight, of platinum is to be treated as an alloy of platinum,
(b) An alloy containing $2 \%$ or more by weight, of gold but no platinum, or less than 25 , by weight, of platinum, is to be treated as an alloy of gold;
(c) Other alloys containing $2 \%$ or more, by weight, of silver are to be treated as alloys of silver.
6. Except where the context otherwise requires, any reference in the Nomenclature to precious metal or to any particular precious metal includes a reference to alloys treated as alloys of precious metal or of the particular metal in accordance with the rules in Note 5 above, but not to metal clad with precious metal or to base
metal or non-metals plated with precious metal.
7. Throughout the Nomenclature the expression "metal clad with precious metal" means material made with a base of metal union one or more surfaces of which there is affixed by soldering, brazing, welding, hot-rolling or similar mechanical means a covering of precious metal. Except where the context otherwise requires the expression also covers base metal inlaid with precious metal.
8. For the purposes of heading No. 71.13, the expression "articles of jewellery" means:
(a) Any small objects of personal adornment (gem-set or not) (for example, rings, bracelets, necklaces, brooches, ear-rings, watch-chains, fobs, pendants, tie-pins, cuff-links, dress-studs, religious or other medals and insignia); and
(b) Articles of personal use of a kind normally carried in the pocket, in the handbag or on the person (such as cigarette cases, powder boxes, chain purses, cachou boxes).
9. 
10. For the purposes of heading No. 71.14, the expression "article of goldsmiths' or silversmiths wares" includes such articles as ornaments, tableware toilet-ware, smokers' requisites and other articles of household, office or religious use.
11. For the purposes of heading No. 71.17, the expression "imitation jewellery" means article of jewellery within the meaning of paragraph (a) of Note 8 above (but not including buttons or other articles of heading No. 96.06 or dress-combs, hairslides or the like, and hairpins, of heading No. 96.15), not incorporating natural or cultured pearls, precious or semi-precious stones (natural, synthetic or reconstructed) nor (except as plating or as minor constituents) precious metal or metal clad with precious metal.

## Subheading Notes.

Tubes and pipes of the foregoing cross-sections may be polished, coated, bent, threaded, drilled, waisted, expanded, cone-shaped or fitted with flanges, collars or rings.

## (a) Zinc, not alloyed

Metal containing by weight at least $97.5 \%$ of zinc
(b) Zinc alloys

Metallic substances in which zinc predominates by weight over each of the other element, provided that the total content by weight of such other elements exceeds $2.5 \%$.
(c) Zinc dust

Dust obtained by condensation of zinc vapour, consisting of spherical particles which are finer than zinc powders. At least $80 \%$ by weight of the particles pass through a sieve with 63 micro metres (microns) mesh. It must contain at least $85 \%$ by weight of metallic zinc.

## (b) Profiles

Rolled, extruded, drawn, forged or formed products coiled or not, of a uniform cross-section along their whole length, which do not conform to any of the definitions of bars, rods, wire, plates, sheets, strip foil, tubes or pipes. Tin and articles thereof

1. In this Chapter the following expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them:

## (a) Bars and rods

Rolled, extruded, drawn or forged products, not in coils, which have a uniform solid cross-section along their whole length in the Shape of circles, ovals rectangles (including squares), equilateral triangles or regular convex polygons (incliding "flattened circles" and "modified rectangles", of which two oppositesides are convex arcs, the other two sides being straight, of equal length and parallel). Products with a rectangular (including square), triangular or polygonal cross-section may have corners rounded along their whole length. The thickness of such products which have a rectangular (including "modified rectangular") cross-section exceeds one-tenth of
the width. The expression also covers cast or sintered products, of the same forms and dimensions, which have been subsequntly woeked after production (otherwise than by simple trimming or descaling), provided that they have not thereby assumed the character of articles of articles or products of other headings.

## (b) Profiles

Rolled, extruded, drawn, forged or formed products coiled or not, of a uniform cross-section along their whole length, which do not conform to any of the definitions of bars, rods, wire, plates, sheets, strip foil, tubes or pipes. The expression also covers cast or sintered products, of the same forms, which have been subsequently worked after production (otherwise than by simple trimming or de-scaling), provided that they not thereby assumed the character of articles or products of other heading.
(c) Wire

Rolled extruded or drawn products, in coils, which have a uniform solidcross-section along their whole length in the shape of circles, ovals, rectangles (including squares), equilateral triangles or regular convex polygons (including "flattened circles' and 'modified rectangles", of which two opposite sides are convex arcs, the other two sides being straight, of equal length and parallel). Products with a rectangular (including square), triangular or polygonal cross-section exceeds one-tenth of the width.

## (d) Plates, sheets, strip and foil

Flat-surfaced products (other than the unwrought products of heading No. 80.01), coiled or not, of solid retangular (other than square) crosssection with or without rounded corners (including "modified rectangles" of which two opposite sides are convex arcs, the other two sides being straight, of equal length and parallel) of a uniform thickness, which are:

- of rectangular (including square) shape with a thinkness not exceeding one-tenth of the width,
- of a shape other than rectangular or square, of any size provided that they do not assume the character of article or products of other headings.
Headings Nos. 80.04 and 80.85 apply, inter alia, to plates sheets, strip and foil with patterns (for example, grooves, ribs, chequers, tears, buttons, lozenges and to such products which have been perforated, corrugated, polished or coated, provided that they do not thereby assume the character of articles or products of other headings.


## (e) Tubes and pipes

Hollow products, coiled or not, which have a uniform cross-section with only one enclosed void along their whole length in the shape of circles, ovals, rectangles (including squares), equilateral triangles or regular convex polygons, and which have a uniform wall thickness. Products with a rectangles (including square), equilateral triangular or regular convex polygonal cross-section, which may have corners rounded along their whole length, are also to be tubes and pipes provided the inner and outer cross-sections are concentric and have the same form and orientation. Tubes and pipes of the foregoing cross-sections may be polished, coated, bent, threaded, drilled, waisted, expanded, cone-shaped or fittted with flanges, collars or rings.

## Subheading Note.

1. In this Chapter the following wxpressions have the meaning hereby assigned to them:
(a) Tin, not alloyed

Metal containing by weight at least $99 \%$ of tin, provided that the content by weight of any bismuth or copper is less than the limit specified in the following table:
