

## Outside security perimeter

The illustration below shows approximately where the security perimeter would be. This is not a final plan. A competition for a landscaping project, which incorporates the security perimeter, will be launched shortly.

Architects, landscapers and security will work together to ensure the future perimeter is as “non-intrusive” as possible and to minimize its impact on general access to the Barton Park. The perimeter will restrict public access only to areas immediately adjacent to the WTO buildings.

The perimeter will include five different accredited pedestrian entry and exit points (see green circles on plan below). These will allow easy passage between the Barton Park and the WTO site. Vehicular access to the WTO site will be provided through the existing vehicle access, which will be equipped with modern vehicle control barriers. Non-WTO registered persons will be able to enter the WTO site after receiving WTO passes at the registration and control building (BCI).



The perimeter will be constructed in order to provide adequate security but with much of the barrier obscured by greenery when viewed from the park.
