REPORT ON THE SIMPLIFIED CONSULTATION WITH BANGLADESH

- 1. The Committee met on 14 March 1995, under the Chairmanship of Mr. P. Witt (Germany), to conduct a consultation with Bangladesh under the simplified procedures for regular consultations with developing countries (BISD 20S/47) and the 1979 Declaration on Trade Measures Taken for Balance-of-Payments Purposes (BISD 26S/205). This consultation was originally scheduled for 1994.

- 3. On the basis of the above-mentioned documents, the Committee reached the following conclusions:
- 4. The Committee welcomed the improvements in Bangladesh's economic performance, which were associated with the economic reform process underway. The Committee encouraged Bangladesh to continue with its liberalization efforts.
- 5. The Committee noted with satisfaction the marked improvements in the balance-of-payments situation of Bangladesh. It was recognized, however, that the balance of payments was financed to a substantial extent by workers' remittances and foreign assistance, debt service remained significant and Bangladesh continued to be prone to natural disasters.
- 6. The Committee decided to recommend to the Council that Bangladesh be deemed to have fulfilled its obligations under Article XVIII:12 (b) of the GATT 1947 for 1995. It noted that the next consultation with Bangladesh would be held in the WTO Committee on Balance-of-Payments Restrictions. The timing and applicable consultation procedures for the next consultation with Bangladesh would be decided by the WTO Committee in accordance with paragraph 8 of the Understanding on the Balance-of-Payments Provisions of the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade 1994.
