Addendum

Evolution of Restrictions since the entry into
force of the Arrangement Regarding International
Trade in Textiles

Attached are tables showing the evolution of restrictions maintained or introduced by participating countries in the Arrangement.

The tables concerning importing countries have been divided into three sections:

1. Restrictions as originally notified under Article 2:1;
2. Restrictions during the period 1 January 1974-31 December 1977;
3. Restrictions maintained or introduced since 1 January 1978 and notified up to 20 September 1980 showing:
 - (a) measures notified under Article 2:1 which have been continued;
 - (b) agreements or measures under the MFA, and
 - (c) other measures.

The tables concerning exporting countries have been divided into two sections:

1. Restrictions as originally notified under Article 2:1, and
2. Restrictions maintained or introduced since 1 January 1978 and notified up to 20 September 1980.
