## ARRANGEMENT REGARDING INTERNATIONAL TRADE IN TEXTILES

## Notification under Article 2:1

#### NORWAY

The Textiles Surveillance Body received a notification, made under Article 2:1, from Norway of all quantitative restrictions maintained by it on imports from MFA participants at the time of its acceptance of the MFA.

The notification has been made in accordance with the decision of the Textiles Committee (COM.TEX/2). After its review, the TSB agreed to transmit the notification to participating countries.

EXISTING NORWEGIAN QUANTITATIVE RESTRICTIONS ON IMPORTS OF TEXTILE PRODUCTS COVERED BY THE ARRANGEMENT REGARDING INTERNATIONAL TRADE IN TEXTILES (MFA) TOWARDS MFA PARTICIPATING COUNTRIES.

The attached list excludes the measures under initialled bilateral agreements based on the MFA III with the following ten participants: Czechoslovakia, Hong Kong, Hungary, Macau, Malaysia, the Philippines, Romania, Singapore, Sri Lanka and Thailand. Furthermore, it should be noted that a bilateral MFA agreement has also been initialled with the Republic of Korea. When this agreement enters into effect on 1 January 1985, the Republic of Korea should be deleted from the list. Finally, bilateral MFA negotiations have been initiated with the People's Republic of China and are due to start with the People's Republic of Poland in the near future.

As to the remaining countries previously covered by the Article XIX measures, reference is made to COM.TEX/27/Add. 12 (page 3) of 10 July 1984.

#### ANNEX I

#### MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

In connection with the Arrangement agreed upon between the Kingdom of Norway and the Republic of Korea in 1968, the annual consultations under this Arrangement for fixing the quotas for 1984 and extending liberalization of trade between the two countries, took place in Oslo from 12 to 14 March 1984, between the Norwegian and Korean delegations.

The two delegations have agreed on the following quotas for the period from 1 January to 31 December 1984:

1. Fabrics

640 tons

2. CCCN 6202

16.5 tons

Table linen, toilet linen and kitchen linen, curtains and other furnishing articles

3. CCCN 6003

16.8 tons

Stockings, under-stockings and socks, knitted or crocheted, other material than containing pure silk

4. Other textile articles and garments

36 tons

(per item limitation)

9 tons

Both parties agreed that the present negotiations were held with due regard to the requirements of the Arrangement Regarding International Trade in Textiles.

It is the understanding that the Norwegian authorities will issue import licences automatically on the basis of Korean export recommendations stating that the consignments in question have been debited to the agreed limits.
