Replace the last two sentences of Mr. ANNIS! (Canada) remarks by the following:

"He had been encouraged to hear the Belgian delegate say that no problem of the reconciliation of domestic policies to the requirements of GATT was insoluble. He hoped it would prove possible for the Working Party to receive the necessary information concerning these national plans which would enable it to grant this request under the terms of the hard-core waiver."

Page 37

Replace the fourth sentence of Baron BENTINCK's (Kingdom of the Netherlands) remarks by the following:

"The formation of an economic union called for measures of transition and adaptation. In the meantime, during the period of formation, trade would be restrictive to a certain extent, even between the Benelux partners themselves. The Netherlands Government had accepted the necessity of this fact and had arrived at an agreement with Belgium as to the duration of the restrictions."
