## WORKING PARTY "H" ON ARTTCIE XVIII

Letter dated 23 March 1950 frum the Leader of the CeritoniDelegation tc the Chairman of the Werking Party:
"I have the honour t.: invite your attentien to my letter dated the 1st August, 1949, addressed to the Chairman of the Contracting Parties, whereby I requested that the following five items, which appear in the renegotiatod Ceylun Schedule, be dealt with under paragraph 5 of Article XVIII:

Plywood chests for packing tea and other Ceylmn

Glassware (Ex III B 235),
Chinaware and Porcelainware (Ex III B 23I),
Leather gouds (III 凤 430),
Cotton textiles (Ex III I' 339.)
```

At the Lendon negotiations it was found that the item "cotton verties", which is included in Tariff item III I 339, had inadvertently been umitted frem the original Ceylon application as well as from the amended application to which I have referred in this letter.

It is the intention uf the Gevernment of Ceylon to bring "cctton verties" under regulation in terms of the Industrial Pruducts Act and I shall accordingly be grateful if the item "cotton verties" be now considered under paragraph 5 Uf Article XVIII. This inadvertent omission and the treatment which the materially affected cnntracting parties have suggested for this item are referred to in paragraph 3 of GATI/CP:4/12 dated the 1st March, 1950, which is already under consideration by your Working Party.

I alsc annex hereto trade statistics for imports in respect of Item III I 339 for the years 1948 and $19490^{\circ}$ It is regretted that information for the preceding years is not availabie ir Geneva."
