## TROPICAL PRODUCTS: INFORMATION ON THE COMMERCIAL POLICY SITUATION AND TRADE FLOWS

### Manioc and Other Tropical Roots and Tubers and their Prepared Products

Note by the Secretariat

#### Addendum

1. Under the work programme of GATT adopted after the conclusion of the Tokyo Round in 1979, the Committee on Trade and Development was given a task to work on further trade liberalization in areas identified as being of special interest to developing countries, which included notably tropical products. In this connexion, the secretariat provided during the year 1981 detailed data on the commercial policy situation and trade flows with respect to a number of tropical products. Data for manioc and other tropical roots were circulated as COM.TD/W/349, and this document was used as background material for the Consultations on Trade Liberalization (tropical products) held in March 1982.

2. The CONTRACTING PARTIES, meeting at Ministerial level in November 1982, decided "to carry out, on the basis of the work programme pursued by the Committee on Trade and Development, consultations and appropriate negotiations aimed at further liberalization of trade in tropical products, including in their processed and semi-processed forms, and to review the progress achieved in eliminating or reducing existing obstacles to trade in tropical products at their 1984 Session". At its meeting on 8 March 1983, the Committee on Trade and Development agreed that the background documentation prepared for the 1982 Consultations on Trade Liberalization would be updated, for the purpose of carrying out the consultations and appropriate negotiations called for by the Ministers.

3. This addendum updates data in document COM.TD/W/349, taking into account discussions in the 1982 Consultations on tropical products. Paragraphs 4 and 5 provide information on the new import arrangements of the European Communities for manioc, and paragraph 7 gives a clarification of certain questions raised in the 1982 Consultations on Japan's commercial policy measures. Tables 1 and 2 show imports into the EEC and Japan, respectively, of manioc products falling within CCCN heading 0706, 1104 (previously 1106), 1108 and 1904 for the period 1977-1981. The Annex to this addendum updates the tariff and trade flow data previously circulated as Annex 2 of COM.TD/W/349. The Annex covers EEC, Japan, Norway, Sweden, Switzerland and the United States. Updated data for certain other developed countries will be provided later as they become available.

European Communities - new import arrangements

4. The European Communities has instituted revised import arrangements for manioc etc. falling within tariff heading 0706 A<sup>1</sup>. The new arrangements provide for three types of import regime:

- (i) In regard to imports from Thailand, the largest supplier to the EEC market, an export restraint agreement has been reached with the Thai authorities. Thailand has undertaken to limit exports in 1982, 1983 and 1984 to 5 million tonnes per annum and in 1985 and 1986 to 4.5 million tonnes per annum. In each of the two-year periods of 1983-84 and 1985-86, an additional 10 per cent of the basic annual quantity may be exported to take into account possible fluctuations in production and trade of manioc. The export restraint will continue for subsequent three-year periods, at the levels applicable in 1985 and 1986, if the agreement is not denounced by either party. The levy on imports within these amounts is limited to 6 per cent ad valorem. According to a report, it was agreed in September 1982 that 500,000 tonnes of manioc could be imported into the EEC from Thailand during 1982 above the quota established for that year. Thailand became a contracting party to GATT on 20 November 1982.
- (ii) In regard to imports from GATT contracting parties as of mid-1982, a tariff quota system has been introduced. To do this, the European Communities has temporarily suspended until 31 December 1986 the GATT binding of 6 per cent ad valorem applicable to tariff item 07.06 A following renegotiations with Indonesia (principal supplier) and Brazil (initial negotiator) under the provisions of GATT Article XXVIII. During the period of suspension, the duty on imports within global quotas open to all contracting parties of 588,235 tonnes in 1982, 882,335 tonnes in both 1983 and 1984 and 970,590 tonnes in 1985 and 1986 has been temporarily bound at 6 per cent. Of these quantities, 85 per cent has been reserved for Indonesia. Thus, the levy on imports within these quantities is limited to 6 per cent ad valorem. Imports above these tariff quota levels are subject to the variable levy foreseen in the EEC common organization of the cereals market. This levy was increased as of 1 August 1982 from 18 per cent of the levy on barley to 100 per cent of the levy on barley. In addition, a fixed component of the levy of 3.02 ECU per tonne has been introduced on manioc pellets and other processed manioc falling under 07.06 A (i.e. processed further than being dried or sliced). It might also be noted that from the same date the Community has increased the levy chargeable on imports under tariff heading 11.04 C I (denatured flour and meal of sago and of roots and tubers falling within heading No. 07.06) from 18 per cent of the levy on barley plus a fixed element of 2.5 ECU per tonne to 100 per cent of the levy on barley plus a fixed element of 3.02 ECU per tonne. The EEC tariff on this item is not bound.

<sup>1</sup>This tariff item covers manioc, arrowroot, salep and other similar roots and tubers with high starch content, excluding sweet potatoes, fresh or dried, whole or sliced.

(iii) In regard to imports from countries not GATT contracting parties (e.g. China), the European Communities has indicated its intention to establish an autonomous quota. An annual quota of 370,000 tonnes was allocated for 1982 and 1983. For 1984, 1985 and 1986 the quantities will be fixed by the Council acting by qualified majority on a proposal from the Commission (cf. COM.TD/SCPM/W/4 and EC Council Regulation No. 604/83 of 14 March 1983).

5. The quantitative limitations applicable to imports of manioc etc. falling within tariff heading 0706 A into the EEC from Thailand, other GATT countries and non-GATT countries are summarized below:

Japan - clarification of certain questions raised on commercial policy measures

7. Manioc imports into Japan takes place mostly in the form of manioc starch. Imports of starches including manioc starch into Japan are subject to global quotas and an m.f.n. duty of 25 per cent. However, most imports take place under duty-exemption quotas granted with respect to imports for such specified uses as the manufacture of glucose and modified starch. The duty-exemption quotas are allocated to an association of agricultural co-operatives in Japan and other importers on the basis of estimated domestic production and consumption for the year. In Japan imports of manioc and manioc flour for feeding purposes have been granted duty-free treatment. No import restrictions apply to these products. Suppliers of these products on the Japanese market compete for a market share with the suppliers of other feeding stuffs in prices, etc. The importation of manioc flour with a sulphur content of more than 30 ppm (parts per million) is not permitted under relevant health and sanitary regulations.

ANNEXTARIFF AND TRADE FLOW DATA AT THE TARIFF LINE LEVELExplanatory notes

With respect to tariff items of developed country markets, the tabulations attached provide information at the tariff line level on different tariff treatment (m.f.n., GSP, LDC, etc.) and the corresponding trade flows, as well as imports from individual main suppliers. Import figures refer to the year 1980. In the first line, tariff item number, product description, and quantity unit are indicated.

IMPORTS FROM (i) WORLD (= all sources) and (ii) GSP ORIGIN (= GSP beneficiary countries) are each sub-divided by TOT (= total imports irrespective of tariff treatment), MFN (= imports for m.f.n. treatment), GSP (imports covered by GSP), LDC (imports entitled to LDC preference) and FTA, ZONE, PREF (= imports entitled to free trade area or other preferential agreements). It may be noted that "imports covered by GSP" do not take into account quantitative and origin rule limitations and non-utilization of GSP and that imports actually accorded GSP treatment are smaller than "imports covered by GSP".

With respect to imports from world and imports according to different tariff treatment, names of five main suppliers appear in column MAIN SUPPLIERS and imports from four main suppliers are indicated at the bottom. See the page after next for country name abbreviations.
