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ARRANGEMENT REGARDING INTERNATIONAL TRADE IN TEXTILES

Report on Status of Restrictive Measures
Under Article 2, Paragraph 4

Note by the Chairman

The Textiles Surveillance Body has received from the EEC a report on the status of the restrictive measures originally notified by the Community in document COM.TEX/SB/17. This report has been submitted to the TSB in accordance with Article 2, paragraphs 2 and 4 of the Arrangement. In its review, the TSB was unable to determine that the actions taken by the EEC are in conformity with the Arrangement. The findings by the TSB in this respect are set out in document COM.TEX/SB/98.

With respect to the negotiations and consultations undertaken by the EEC which are still in progress, or are to take place with a view to reaching mutually satisfactory solutions, the TSB expressed the hope that they would be successfully concluded as soon as possible.

In view of the communication received from the EEC, the TSB concurred in an extension of the time limit, in accordance with article 2, paragraph 2, of the arrangement. The TSB requested a report from the EEC on the progress made within ninety days of the date of the report, i.e. by 30 June 1975.

The TSB is circulating this notification to participating countries in the Arrangement for their information.

This report includes a programme for the elimination of existing restrictions as well as the actions taken within the Community since the entry into force of the Arrangement in relation to existing restrictions as notified in document COM.TEX/SB/17.

Programme for the Elimination of Existing Restrictions

The Community's programme for the elimination of existing restrictions within the framework of the Arrangement Regarding International Trade in Textiles is divided into two parts. The first relates to the arrangements to be made for those parties to the Arrangement with which the Community proposes to conclude bilateral agreements on trade in textiles. The second part of the Community's programme relates to those parties with which the Community does not intend to negotiate such agreements.

Countries with which the Community intends to negotiate

The Community has notified the following countries of its wish to undertake consultations and negotiations with them pursuant to the provisions of the Arrangement.

As soon as these bilateral negotiations and consultations have led to a mutually satisfactory conclusion, the Community will proceed to eliminate, as completely as possible, restrictions existing in respect of these countries, it being understood, nevertheless, that any residual restrictions will be dealt with in programmes which will ensure their elimination before 1 April 1977. The Community will put forward its programmes in respect of the above countries as soon as negotiations with them have been concluded.

The Community takes the view that the provisions of the Arrangement relating to an extension of the time-limit regarding bilateral negotiations are applicable to it in order that these negotiations may be completed.

Countries with which the Community does not intend to negotiate

In accordance with Article 2:2(i) of the Arrangement, the Community hereby notifies the TSB of the annexed programme of existing restrictions which it intends to eliminate in stages at latest by 1 April 1977.

REGULATION (EEC) No 348/75 OF THE COUNCIL

of 10 February 1975

setting up a system of licences for imports of cotton yarn into the United
Kingdom from third countries

THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community;

Having regard to Council Regulation (EFC) No 1439/74 (1) of 4 June 1974 on common rules for imports from third countries, and in particular Article 12 thereof;

Having regard to the proposal from the Commission;

Having consulted the Advisory Committee established under Article 5 of that Regulation;

Whereas, for the period from 1 April to 31 December 1973 and for the whole of 1974, by its Regulations (EEC) No 2631/73(²), and (EEC) No 657/74(³), the Council set up a system of licences for imports of cotton yarn into the United Kingdom from third countries:

Whereas, further to a request from the United Kingdom Government, the Commission, acting under Article 12 of Regulation (EEC) No 1439/74, established by Regulation (EEC) No 3327/74 (*) a system of licences for imports into the United Kingdom of cotton yarn originating in and exported from third countries, under the same conditions as those provided for in Regulation (EEC) No 675/74 setting up the same system for 1974;

Whereas it appears from the statistics and other information supplied by the United Kingdom Government during consultations with the abovementioned Advisory Committee that the sudden liberalization of imports from the countries listed in Annex II to Regulation (EEC) No 1439/74 would, in present circumstances, still be likely to cause substantial injury, which would be difficult to repair, to the British cotton-spinning industry, especially since the volume

of imports from Mediterranean countries has increased substantially;

Whereas it is therefore necessary to stend the protective measures restricting imports of cotton yarn;

Whereas, since the threat of substantial injury originates in imports intended for the United Kingdom market, it appears justified at present, in view of existing trade flows, to restrict the application of the protective measures to imports into the United Kingdom;

Whereas the obligations resulting from the Arrangement regarding International Trade in Textiles (5), and in particular the need to increase gradually the volume of imports of products subject to quantitative restrictions, require liberalization to be achieved by 31 March 1977 at the latest;

Whereas it accordingly appears appropriate immediately to fix the level of restrictions for the entire period of gradual liberalization, that is until 31 March 1977;

Whereas these protective measures may be amended or revoked to take account of import trends in other regions of the Community,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

1. Imports into the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland from the third countries listed in Annex II to Regulation (EEC) No 1439/74, with the exception of those countries listed in the Annex hereto, of the products shown below shall be subject to production of an import licence and limited to the following quantities:

2. The import licences referred to in paragraph 1 shall be issued by the United Kingdom.

Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on the day following its publication in the Official Journal of the European Communities.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.

autonomously increasing Community imports of cotton fibres which are subject to measures of voluntary restraint by certain third countries

(74/515/EEC)

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community;

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 1471/70 (1) of 20 July 1970 establishing a common procedure for the autonomous increase of imports into the Community of products subject to measures of voluntary restraint by experting countries;

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 1023/70 (2) of 25 May 1970 establishing a common procedure for administering quantitative quotas, and in particular Article 11 thereof;

Whereas the Community has concluded agreements on trade in cotton fibres with the Arab Republic of Egypt (*), the Republic of India (*), the Republic of Korea (*) and the Islamic Republic of Pakistan (*);

Whereas although these agreements expired in 1973 imports of cotton fabrics originating in and coming from these countries are still covered by the voluntary restraint measures specified in these agreements and increased autonomously by Commission Decisions;

Whereas it is necessary to autonomously increase certain of these ceilings for 1974 in response to the requests formulated by the third countries concerned;

Whereas the measures provided for in this Decision are in accordance with the Opinion of the Management Committee for Quota,

HAS ADOPTED THIS DECISION:

Article 1

The quota ceilings in the agreements on the trade in cotton fabrics concluded by the European Economic Community and the following countries:

(75/67/EEC)

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community;

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No. 1471/70 of 20 July 1970 establishing a common procedure for the autonomous increase of imports into the Community of products subject to measures of voluntary restraint by the exporting countries:

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No. 1023/70 of 25 May 1970 establishing a common procedure for administering quantitative quotas, and in particular Article II thereof:

Whereas the Community has concluded an Agreement with Japan on trade in cotton textiles;

Whereas that Agreement expired in 1973, but whereas cotton textiles originating in and coming from that country continue to be imported under the arrangement for voluntary restraint set out in that Agreement and within the ceilings provided for by that Agreement as increased autonomously by the Commission Decision of 8 March 1973:

Whereas in view of the request put forward by Japan it has become necessary to increase these ceilings autonomously;

Whereas the measures provided for in this Decision are in accordance with the Opinion of the Quota Administration Committee,

HAS ADOPTED THIS DECISION:

Article 1

The quantitative ceilings set out in the Agreement concerning the cotton textile trade concluded between the European Economic Community and Japan and signed on 7 February 1972 are, for the six months from 30 September 3974 to 31 March 1975, raised autonomously to the levels indicated below:

Group I

Woven fabrics of cotton, unbleached or bleached, whether or not mercerized

3,204 metric tons

Group II

Other woven fabrics of cotton, made-up articles 3,708 metric tons and miscellaneous articles of cotton

Article 2

This Decision is addressed to the Member States.

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No. 1471/70 of 20 July 1970 establishing a common procedure for the autonomous increase of imports into the Community of products subject to measures of voluntary restraint by exporting countries;

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No.1023/70 of 25 May 1970 establishing a common procedure for administering quantitative quotas, and in particular Article 11 thereof:

Whereas the Community concluded Agreements on trade in cotton textiles with the Republic of Korea, the Republic of India, the Islamic Republic of Pakistan and the Arab Republic of Egypt, and with the Socialist Federal Republic of Yugoslavia;

Whereas the Agreements which expired in 1973 were extended for 1974 and imports of cotton textiles originating in and coming from the countries in question have continued to be carried out under the system of voluntary restraint defined in those Agreements within the limits of the ceilings provided for therein;

Whereas the Agreement with Yugoslavia expired on 31 December 1974:

Whereas in view of the state of progress of the negotiations to conclude new agreements, it will be necessary to extend the provisions of the Old Agreements for a further period:

Whereas under the new arrangement regarding international trade in textiles, the Community must increase the voluntary restraint ceilings at present in force;

Whereas the measures provided for in this Decision are in accordance with the Opinion of the Quota Administration Committee,

HAS ADOPTED THIS DECISION:

Article 1

The quantitative ceilings set in the Agreements on trade in cotton textiles between the European Economic Community and the following countries:

Status of Bilateral Negotiations Undertaken by the European Economic Community (Negotiations completed, in Progress or to be Undertaken)

l. <u>India</u>

Agreement was reached on 19 April 1975 between the Community and the Republic of India on the provisions of a bilateral agreement on textiles, negotiated under Article 4 of the GATT Arrangement regarding International Trade in Textiles.

The Agreement sets quantitative limits for exports by India to the Community of cotton cloth, certain house linen and women's blouses for the years 1975, 1976 and 1977; it stipulates special procedures in order to ward off real risks of market collapse in the Community, with immediate introduction of quantitative limits in respect of cotton terry towelling, men's cotton shirts and cotton handkerchiefs for the United Kingdom, and T-shirts for France.

The objectives of the GATT Arrangement, and in particular the need to promote the conditions for orderly expansion of trade, are respected in full. The Agreement, which is of a selective character, affords better protection of European industry which is facing serious difficulties, while allowing unrestricted diversification of India's trade. Hand-loom fabrics and temporary imports are not subject to quantitative limitations, and at the same time there are provisions that will allow India to increase its export earnings through the development of trade in textiles.

2. Pakistan

Negotiations with this country have already been started and will be resumed in the near future, if acceptable conditions so warrant.

3. Hong Kong

The second phase of the negotiations with Hong Kong will commence on 12 May 1975. The two parties have expressed their wish to complete the negotiations, if possible, during the second phase.

4. South Korea

The next phase of negotiations is envisaged for 26 May 1975.

5. Singapore - Macao - Malaysia

The Commission has negotiating mandates which still have to be approved by the Council of Ministers. The date for the negotiations will be set as soon as possible.

6. Yugoslavia

Internal discussions for preparing the negotiating mandate are not yet completed.

7. Colombia and Mexico

The Commission has a mandate which still has to be approved by the Council of Ministers.

8. Brazil

The mandate exists and preparatory conversations for the negotiations will be held at Brasilia in the week of 5 May 1975.

9. Japan

Discussions took place at Brussels on 29 and 30 April between the Community and Japan to define the undertaking of negotiations. These contacts will be resumed towards the end of June 1975.

10. Poland - Romania - Hungary

Romania and Hungary have given a favourable answer to an invitation by the Community. Mandates are being examined at internal level in Brussels. Poland has not yet made its position known.

11. Egypt

The Commission has a negotiating mandate, and preliminary discussions will take place with this country as soon as possible, in particular, to set the date for opening the negotiations.

12. Thailand

The Commission has a negotiating mandate and preliminary discussions will take place shortly, in particular, to set the date for opening the negotiations.
