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ARRANGEMENT REGARDING INTERNATIONAL TRADE IN TEXTILES

Notification under Articles 7 and 8

The TSB has received from the EUROPEAN ECONOMIC COMMUNITY a notification of unilateral measures taken with respect to imports of certain textile products from a non-participant in the Arrangement. This notification has been submitted to the TSB in accordance with its decision that actions taken vis-à-vis non-participants should be notified.

The TSB has examined the documentation and is circulating the texts of the relevant Community regulations to participating countries for information.

REGULATION (EEC) No 1783/75 OF THE COUNCIL of 10 July 1975

on rules for imports of certain textile products originating in Taiwan

THE COUNCIL OF THE FUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community, and in particular Article 113 thereof;

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 1439/74 (1) of 4 June 1974 on common rules for imports, and in particular Articles 7 and 13 thereof;

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 1023/70 (2) of 25 May 1970 establishing a common procedure for administering quantitative quotas, and in particular Article 2 thereof;

Having regard to the proposal from the Commissions;

Whereas rules for imports of certain textile products originating in Taiwan should be adopted within the context of the revision of the rules in force in the Community, taking account of the Community's international obligations towards certain third countries;

Whereas the inclusion of these products in the common list of liberalized products cannot be envisaged at the present time since such a measure might increase the serious difficulties to which the Community textile industry is at present subject, thereby creating situations which would justify the application of safeguard measures;

Whereas Community quantitative quotas should be established for certain textiles originating in Taiwan;

Whereas for the years 1975, 1976 and 1977 the size of these quotas should be fixed in such a way as to allow a certain annual growth whilst avoiding substantial injury to the Community producers concerned;

Whereas, because of the considerable disparities between the conditions to which imports into Member States are at present subject and because of the particular sensitivity of the Community textile industry, harmonization of these conditions can be achieved only gradually; whereas, to this end, the main criterion for the allocation of the Community quantitative quotas should be that the size admitted under the present import conditions should be gradually adapted to the supply needs of the markets;

Whereas at the present stage quantitative restrictions applicable in the Member States should be laid down in respect of certain other textiles originating in Taiwan in such a way as to allow a certain annual growth in imports whilst avoiding substantial injury to the Community producers concerned and to facilitate the subsequent harmonization of these measures under the common commercial policy; whereas, moreover, these imports are likely to be detrimental to the interests of Community producers of similar or competing products and should therefore be subjected to Community surveillance;

Whereas it is necessary to provide that products introduced into the customs territory of the Community under the inward processing rules or under temporary admission rules and re-exported in the same state or after processing, are not to be set off against Community quantitative quotas or quantitative quotas applicable in the Member States;

Whereas the Commission has consulted the Advisory Committee set up under Article 5 of Regulation (EEC) No 1439/74,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

- 1. Importation into the Community of the textile products listed in Annex I and originating in Taiwan is hereby made subject to Community quantitative quotas.
- 2. For the years 1975, 1976 and 1977 the size of the quotas shall be that given in the list referred to in paragraph 1. However, the size indicated in that list for the years 1976 and 1977 may be reviewed prior to its application.

The size indicated for 1975 shall be reduced by the volume of the imports effected in that year prior to the opening of the quotas.

3. The quotas shall be allocated, in accordance with the procedure set out in Article 11 of Regulation (EEC) No 1023/70, in such a way as to ensure the

expansion and orderly development of trade in textiles and to allow for carry-forward and anticipation from one year to another.

However, the allocation shall be fixed on the basis of the volume of imports admitted under the conditions currently applied by Member States and shall include considerably higher annual growth rates for those Member States having the lowest volumes, in such a way as to align them progressively on the supply needs of the markets.

Article 2

1. Importation of the products listed in Annex II and originating in Taiwan is hereby made subject to quantitative quotas in the Member States mentioned in that list.

Without prejudice to paragraph 4, this Regulation shall not affect the rules for imports into the other Member States of these products originating in Taiwan.

2. For the years 1975, 1976 and 1977 the size of the quotas shall be that given in the list referred to in paragraph 1. However, the size indicated in that list for the years 1976 and 1977 may be reviewed prior to its application.

The size indicated for 1975 shall be reduced by the volume of the imports effected in that year prior to the opening of the quotas.

- 3. The quantitative quotas shall be opened and administered in accordance with the provisions applicable in the Member States concerned.
- 4. Importation of the products referred to in paragraph I shall be subject to Community surveillance in accordance with the rules laid down in Articles 8 and 11 of Regulation (EEC) No 1439/74. The import documents issued or referred to under the surveillance

system may be used for a maximum period of six months.

Where in a Member State importation of a particular product is subject to an import authorization by virtue of a quantitative quota provided for in paragraph 1, this authorization shall replace the import document referred to in Article 8 (1) of the abovementioned Regulation.

Article 3

- 1. Member States may authorize imports in excess of the quantitative quotas provided for in Article 2, either by carrying forward the quantities not used from the quotas for the previous year or by anticipation of the quotas for the following year, each of these transfers being limited to a maximum of 10 % of the increased quota.
- 2. With a view to improving the utilization of the quantitative quotas provided for in Article 2, the size of these quotas may be adapted in accordance with the procedure provided for in Article 11 of Regulation (EEC) No 1023/70.

Article 4

Products referred to in Articles 1 and 2 which are introduced into the customs territory of the Community under the inward processing rules or under temporary admission rules and re-exported from that territory in the same state or after processing shall not be set off against the quotas provided for in Articles 1 and 2.

Article 5

This Regulation shall enter into force on the third day following its publication in the Official Journal of the European Communities.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.

REGULATION (EEC) No 1849/75 OF THE COMMISSION of 18 July 1975

allocating quantitative quotas in respect of imports into the Community of certain textile products originating in Taiwan

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 1023/70 (1) of 25 May 1970 establishing a common procedure for administering quantitative quotas, and in particular Article 2 thereof;

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 1783/75 (2) of 10 July 1975 on rules for imports of certain textile products originating in Taiwan, and in particular Article 1 thereof;

Whereas Article 1 of the abovementioned Council Regulation (EEC) No 1783/75 establishes Community quantitative quotas and provides that such quotas must be administered by allocation among the Member States in accordance with the criteria indicated;

Whereas, however, the conditions at present governing the imports concerned into the Member States could not be fully standardized as from the time the quotas were opened by reason of the wide disparities between those conditions and of the particularly sensitive nature of the Community textile industry and whereas for this reason the criteria of allocation were so determined that the allocation would be only progressively adjusted to the supply requirements of the markets;

Whereas the allocation must permit carry-over and advance drawing of quota shares as between one year and another;

Whereas, in accordance with the abovementioned Council Regulation (EEC) No 1783/75, products brought into the customs territory of the Community under inward processing arrangements or under temporary admission arrangements and re-exported in the same state or after processing are not to be charged against the quota shares concerned;

Whereas the measures provided for in this Regulation are in accordance with the Opinion of the Quota Administration Committee,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

- 1. The quantitative quotas in respect of imports into the Community established for 1975, 1976 and 1977 by Regulation (EEC) No 1783/75 of 10 July 1975 shall be allocated among the Member States as shown in the Annex hereto:
- 2. The quota shares fixed for 1975 shall be reduced by the volume of imports recorded in that year prior to the opening of the quotas concerned.

The Member States shall inform the Commission of the volumes thus subtracted.

Article 2

The Member States may authorize imports in excess of the quota shares as established by Article 1, either by carrying over quantities not utilized from the quota shares of the preceding year or by advance drawing on the quota shares for the following year, provided that the quota share in respect of any one year may not be thus increased by more than 10 %.

The Member States shall inform the Commission of the quantities so carried over or drawn in advance.

Article 3

Products covered by the Community quantitative quotas referred to in Article 1 which are brought into the customs territory of the Community under inward processing arrangements or under temporary admission arrangements and re-exported from that territory in the unaltered state or after processing shall not be charged against the quota shares as established in Article 1.

Article 4

This Regulation shall enter into force on the day following its publication in the Official Journal of the European Communities.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.
