ARRANGEMENT REGARDING INTERNATIONAL TRADE IN TEXTILES

Notification under Article 4

Amendment to the Bilateral Agreement between the United States and Haiti

The Textiles Surveillance Body has received a notification from the United States of a further amendment to its bilateral agreement under Article 41/4 with Haiti.

Pursuant to its procedure regarding the review of Article $\frac{4^2}{}$ agreements, the TSB examined the relevant documentation, and is circulating the text of the notification to participating countries for their information.

UNITED STATES AND HAITI AMEND TEXTILE AGREEMENT

The United States and Haiti exchanged notes on October 13, 1978 to amend the existing bilateral textile agreement. The texts of the notes follow:

UNITED STATES NOTE

October 13, 1978

His Excellency Georges Salomon Ambassador of Haiti

Excellency:

I have the honor to refer to the Arrangement Regarding International Trade in Textiles, with annexes, done at Geneva on December 20, 1973, extended December 15, 1977 and to the Agreement between the United States of America and Haiti concerning Trade in Cotton, Wool and Man-made Fiber Textiles and Textile Products, effected by exchange of notes March 22 and 23, 1976, as amended (hereinafter referred to as the "Agreement"). I have further the honor to refer to discussions concerning trade in textiles and textile products between representatives of the Government of Haiti and the Government of the United States of America in Washington during recent months. On the basis of these discussions and in accordance with Article 4 of the Arrangement, I have the honor to propose that the Agreement be further amended by the following changes to Annex 3 of the Note of November 23, 1977, setting out indicative quantities:
