ARRANGEMENT REGARDING INTERNATIONAL TRADE IN TEXTILES

Report on the Status of Restrictive Measures as
Requested by the TSR in Accordance
with Article 11, paragraphs 11 and 12

Pursuant to its request 1, the TSB has received from the United States a report 2 on the present status of its restrictive measures maintained against textiles. This report has been submitted in accordance with Article 11, paragraphs 11 and 12 of the Arrangement.

The TSB is circulating this notification to participating countries for their information.

Dear Mr. Chairman,

In response to your letter of 10 July 1979, and to the obligation on MFA participants arising from Article 2 of the Arrangement Regarding International Trade in Textiles, I am instructed by my Government to render a status report of restrictions on trade in textiles in effect on 1 September 1979.

The United States currently has in effect restrictions on textile products with twenty—ne countries; these restrictions are outlined in twenty Article 4 biaseral agreements and two unilateral restraint actions. The United States has consultation agreements which do not embody any restraints with twelve countries, as well as a visa agreement (no restraints) with one country.

Each of the restraint actions and bilateral agreements referred to above and outlined on the attached chart has been duly notified to the TSB except for a new Article 4 bilateral agreement between the United States and Japan, which will be notified shortly.

Attached is a chart which outlines the status of these various agreements and restraint actions as of 1 September 1979.
