UNITED STATES AND THE POLISH PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC SIGN TEXTILE AGREEMENT

The United States and the Polish People's Republic exchanged letters on March 31, 1980 and April 1, 1980, respectively, to amend the existing bilateral textile agreement. The texts of the letters follow:
