#### ARRANGEMENT REGARDING INTERNATIONAL TRADE IN TEXTILES

#### Notification under Article 4:4

#### Bilateral Agreement between the EEC and Pakistan

The Textiles Surveillance Body has received from the Commission of the European Communities a notification of a new bilateral agreement initialled with Pakistan under Article 4 of the MFA, in <u>de facto</u> application with effect from 1 January 1983 and valid until 31 December 1986.

The TSB, pursuant to its procedures regarding bilateral agreements notified under Article 4<sup>2</sup>, has examined the relevant documentation and is forwarding the text of the notification to participating countries for their information.

#### AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE EUROPEAN ECONOMIC COMMUNITY AND THE ISLAMIC REPUBLIC OF PAKISTAN ON TRADE IN TEXTILE PRODUCTS

THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES.

THE COVERNMENT OF THE ISLAMIC REPUGLIC OF PAKISTAN:

i of the other part,

DESIRING to promote, with a view to permanent co-operation and in conditions providing every security for trade, the orderly and equitable development of trade in textile products between the European Economic Community (mereinafter referred to as "the Community") and

RESOLVED to take the fullest possible account of the serious economic and social problems at present affecting the textile industry in both importing and exporting countries, and in particular, to eliminate real risks of market disruption on the market of the Community and real risks of disruption to the textile trade of

HAVING RECARD to the Arrangement regarding International Trade in Textiles (hereinafter referred to as "the Geneva Arrangement"), and in particular Article 4 thereof; and to the conditions set out in the Protocol extending the Arrangement together with the Conclusions adopted on 22 December 1981 by the Textiles Committee.

HAVE DECIDED to conclude this igreement and to this end have designated as their Plenipotentiaries :

THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES :

THE COVERNMENT OF THE ISLAMIC REPUBLIC OF, PAKISTAN

VED EATS AGREED AS FOLLOWS :

#### SECTION I : TRADE ARRANGEMENTS

#### ARTICLE 1

- I. The parties recognize and confirm that, Subject to the provisions of this Agreement and without prejudice to their rights and obligations under the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade, the conduct of their mutual trade in tertile products shall be governed by the provisions of the Geneva Arrangement.
- 2. In respect of the products covered by this Agreement, the Community undertakes not to introduce quantitative restrictions under Article XIX of the General Agreement on Tariffs and Tride or Article 3 of the Geneva Arrangement.
- Xeasures having equivalent effect to quantitative restrictions on the importation into the Community of the products covered by this ignomment shall be prohibited.

#### ARTICLE 2

1. This Agreement shall apply to trade in taxtile products of cotton, wool and zam-cade fibres originating in Pakistan which are listed in innex [.

- 2. The classification of the products covered by this Agreement is based on the nonenclature of the Common Customs Tariff and on the Homenclature of Goods for the External Trade Statistics of the Community and the Statistics of Trade between Member States (MIMENE).
- 3. The origin of the products covered by this igreement shall be determined in accordance with the rules in force in the Community

The procedures for control of the origin of the products referred. to above are laid down in Protocol i.

#### ARTICLE 3

Pakistan ... agrees for each igreement year to restrain its exports to the Community of the products described in innex II to the limits set out therein.

Exports of textile products set out in innex II shall be subject to a double-checking system specified in Protocol i.

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#### ARTICLE 4

Pakistan and the Community recognize the special and differential character of re-imports of textile products into the Community after processing in Pakistan.

Such re-imports may be agreed outside the quantitative limits established under this ignoment provided that they are effected in accordance with the regulations on economic outward processing in force in the Community.

### ARTICLE 5

1. Exports of cottage industry fabrics woven on hand- or fcot-operated looms, garments or other articles obtained manually from such fabrics and traditional folklore handicraft products shall not be subject to quantitative limits, provided that these products meet the conditions laid down in Protocol B.

#### ARTICLE &

1. Imports into the Community of textile products covered by this Agreement shall not be subject to the quantitative limits established in Annex II, provided that they are declared to be for re-export outside the Community in the same state or after processing, under the administrative system of control set up for this purpose within the Community.

However, the release for home use of products imported under the conditions referred to above shall be subject to the production of an export licence issued by the Pakistani authorities, and to proof of origin in accordance with the provisions of Protocol A.

2. Where the Community authorities have evidence that imports of textile products have been set off against a quantitative limit established under this Agreement, but that the products have subsequently been re-exported outside the Community, the authorities concerned shall inform the Pakistani authorities within four weeks of the quantities involved and authorize imports of identical quantities of the same products, which shall not be set off against the quantitative limit established under this Agreement for the current or the following year.

#### JETICLE 7

1. In any Agreement year advance use of a portion of the quantitative limit established for the following Agreement year is authorized for each category of products up to 5% of the quantitative limit for the current Agreement year.

icounts delivered in advance shall be deducted from the corresponding quantitative limits established for the following Agreement year.

- 2. Carryover to the corresponding quantitative limit for the following Agreement year of amounts not used during any Agreement year is anthorized for each category of products up to 5% of the quantitative limit for the current Agreement year.
- J. Transfers in respect of categories in Group I shall not be made from any category except as follows :
  - transfors between Categories 2 and 3 and from Category 1 to Categories 2 and 3 may be made up to 5% of the quantitative limits for the category to which the transfer is made.

transfers between Categories 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8 may be made up to 5% of the quantitative limit for the category to which the transfer is made.

Transfers into any category in Groups II and III may be made from any category or categories in Groups I. II and III up to 5.% of the quantitative limit for the category to which the transfer is made.

- 4. The table of equivalence applicable to the transfers referred to
  above is given in Annex I to this Agreement.
- 5. The increase in any category of products resulting from the cumulative application of the provisions in paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 above during an Agreement year shall not exceed 15%.
- 6. Prior notification shall be given by the authorities of Pakistan in the event of recourse to the provisions of paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 above.

#### ARTICLE 8

- Exports of textile products not listed in innex II to this Agreement may be made subject to quantitative limits by Pakistan. on the conditions laid down in the following paragraphs.
- 2. Where the Community finds, under the system of administrative control set up, that the level of imports of products in a given category not listed in Annex II originating in Pakistan. exceeds, in relation to the preceding year's total imports into the Community from all sources of products in that category, the following rates :

It may request the opening of consultations in accordance with the procedure described in Article 17 of this Agreement, with a view to reaching agreement on an appropriate restraint lavel for the products in such category.

The Community shall authorise the importation of products of the said category shipped from Pakistan before the date on which the request for consultations was submitted.

- 3. Pending a mutually satisfactory solution, Pakistan undertakes to limit exports of the products in the category concerned to the Community or to the region or regions of the Community market specified by the Community for a provisional period of 3 months from the date on which the request for consultations is made. Such provisional limit shall be established at 25% of the level of imports reached during the calendar year preceding that in which imports exceeded the level resulting from the application of the formula set out in paragraph 2, and gave rise to the request for consultation or 25% of the level resulting from the application of the formula set out in paragraph 2, whichever is the higher.
- 4. Should the Parties be unable in the course of consultations to reach a satisfactory solution within the period specified in Article 17 of the Agreement, the Community shall have the right to introduce a definitive quantitative limit at an annual level not lower than the level resulting from the application of the formula set out in paragraph 2, or 106% of the level of imports reached during the calendar year preceding that in which imports exceeded the level resulting from the application of the formula form the application of the formula form the application of the level resulting from the application of the formula, which we have the request for consultationa, which we have the higher.

The annual level so fixed shall be revised upwards after consultations in accordance with the procedure referred to in inticle 17, with a view to fulfilling the conditions set out in paragraph 2, should the trend of total imports into the Community of the product in question make this necessary.

- 5. The limits introduced under paragraph 2 or paragraph 4 may in no case be lower than the level of imports of products in that category originating in Pakistan in 1980.
- 6. Quantitative limits may also be established by the Community on a regional basis in accordance with the provisions of Protocol C.
- 7. The annual growth rate for the quantitative limits introduced under this Article shall be determined in accordance with the provisions of Protocol D.
- 3. The provisions of this Article shall not apply where the percentage specified in paragraph 2 have been reached as a result of fall in total imports into the Community, and not as a result of an increase in exports of products originating in
- 9. In the event of the provisions of paragraph 2, 3 or 4 being applied, Pakistan undertakes to issue export licences for products covered by contracts concluded before the introduction of the quantitative limit, up to the volume of the quantitative limit fixed.
- 10. Up to the date of communication of the statistics referred to in Article 10 paragraph 6, the provisions of paragraph 2 of this Article shall apply on the basis of the annual statistics previously communicated by the Community.
- 11. The provisions of this Agreement which concern exports of product: subject to the quantitative limits established in Annex II shall also apply to products for which quantitative limits are introduced under this Article.

#### ARTICLE 9

- Le Where the Community ascertains that the level of imports in a given category of Group I subject to quantitative limits set out in Annez II exceeds in any Agreement year the level of imports in the preceding year by 10% of the level of the quantitative limit set out in innex II for the current Agreement year, it may request with a view to avoiding palpable damage to domestic industry the opening of consultations in accordance with the provisions described in Article 17 of this Agreement with a view to reaching agreement on:
  - the suspension, wholly or in part, of the provisions of inticle 7, or
  - a modification of the quantitative limit set out in Annex II by the establishment of an ad hoo limit below the existing quantitative limit
  - as well as the corresponding equitable and quantifiable compensation which constitutes a mutually acceptable solution.
- 2. The Community shall authorize the importation of products of the said category shipped from Pakistan Defore the date on which the request for consultations was submitted.

Pending a mutually satisfactory solution, Pakistan undertakes for a period of 1 month from the date of notification of the request for consultations, to restrain exports of the products in the category concerned to the Community or to the region or regions of the Community market specified by the Community to one twelfth of the level of exports reached during the preceding calendar year.

- Jo A quantitative limit modified as a result of the application of paragraph 1 in any year preceding the final Agreement year shall be subject to a growth rate so as to ensure that the level of the quantitativ limit set out in Annex II for the final Agreement year is regained in that year.
- A. Should the Parties be unable in the course of consultations to reach a satisfactory solution within the period specified in Article:17 of the Article:17. Pakistan. undertakes, if so requested by the Community:
  - to suspend wholly or in part, the provisions of Article 7 in respect of the Community or any of its regions for the category concarned, or

• to modify the quantitative limit set out in Annex II for the category concerned to as to restrain exports to the Community or any of its regions to 125% of imports attained during the preceding calendar year, or to the level of exports up to the date of the request for consultations plus the level of exports provided for during the consultation period under paragraph 2, whichever is the higher.

In the event that the provisions of this paragraph are applied the Community undertakes to maintain an offer of equitable and quantifiable compensation.

The application of the necsures provided for in this paragraph is limited to the year in which the neasures are taken.

- 5. The provisions of paragraph 1 shall not apply to a given category unless the quantitative limits established in Annex II for the Community for that category represent at least 1% of total Community imports during 1980.
- So The provisions of paragraph 1 shall not apply to a given category unless the level of imports originating in Pakistan during the current Agreement year represent at least 50% of the quantitative limit set out in Annex II for that category in the Community as a whole or in any region or regions of the Community concerned.
- 7. Iny limit modified in accordance with the provisions of paragraphs 1 or a may in no case be lower than the level of imports of products in that category originating in Pakistan in 1980.
- 5. The provisions of the article also apply where the lavel referred to in paragraph 1 is exceeded in any of the Community's regions. In such a ca the compensation referred to in paragraphs 1 and 4 will concern the region or regions of the Community indicated in the Community's request for consultations.
- 9. With a view to limiting recourse to paragraph 1 of this Article, Pakistan undertakes to inform the Community of any sharp and substantial increas: in the issue of export licences for any category which is likely to lear to the fulfilment of the conditions required for the application of the present article.

#### ARTICLE 10

- 2. Pakistan undertakes to supply the Community with precise statistical information on all export licences issued by the Pakistani. authorities for all categories of textile products subject to the quantitative limits established under this Agreement as well as on all certificates issued by the Pakistani authorities for all products referred to in Article 5 and subject to the provisions of Protocol B.
  - The Community shall likewise transmit to the Pakistani authorities precise statistical information on import authorizations or documents issued by the Community authorities in respect of export licences and certificates issued by Pakistan
- 2. The information referred to in paragraph 1 shall, for all categories of products, be transmitted before the end of the second month following the quarter to which the statistics relate.
- 3. Pakistan also undertakes to supply the Community with available statistical information on all textile exports by country of destination.

The Community shall transmit to the Pakistani. authorities import statistics for all products covered by the system of administrative control referred to. in Article 8, Paragraph 2 and for products covered by Article 6 Paragraph 1.

- 4. The information referred to in paragraph 3 shall, for all categories of products, be transmitted before the end of the third month following the quarter to which the statistics relate.
- 5. Should it be found on analysis of the information exchanged that there are significant descrepancies between the returns for exports and those for import: consultations may be initiated in accordance with the procedure specified in Article 17 of this Agreement.
- 6. For the purpose of applying the provisions of Article 3, and Article 9, the Community undertakes to provide the Pakistani authorities before 15 April of each year with the preceding year's statistics on imports of all textile products covered by this Agreement, broken down by supplying country and Community Member State.

#### ARTICLE 11

- In case of divergent opinions between Pakistan, and the competent Community authorities at the point of entry into the Community on the classification of products covered by the present Agreement, classification shall provisionally be based on indications provided by the Community, pending consultations in accordance with Article 17 with a view to reaching agreement on definitive classification of the product concerned.
- 2. The authorities of Pakistan : shall be informed of any amendment to the Common Customs Tariff or Nimexe or any decision, made in accordance with the procedures in force in the Community, relating to the classification of products covered by this Agreement.

Any amendment to the Common Customs Tariff or Nimexs or any decision which results in a modification of the classification or products covered by this Agreement shall not have the effect of reducing any quantitative limit establishe in Annex II.

The procedures for the application of this Paragraph are set out in Protocol A.

LATICIE 12

- Le Pakistan and the Community agree to cooperate fully in preventing the circumvention of the present Agreement by transchipment, recouting or whatever other means.
- 2. Where information available to the Community as a result of the investigations carried out in accordance with the procedures set out in Protocol A constitutes evidence that products of Pakistani, origin subjust to quantitative limits established under this Agreement have been transchipped, rerouted or otherwise imported into the Community in circumvention of this Agreement, the Community may requise the opening of consultations in accordance with the procedures described in Article : of this Agreement, with a view to reaching agreement.on an equivalent adjustment of the corresponding quantitative limits established under the Agreement.
  - 3. Pending the result of the consultations referred to in paragraph 2, Pakistan shall as a precautionary zensure, if so requested by the Communimake the necessary arrangements to ensure that adjustments of quantitatilimits liable to be agreed following the consultations referred to in paragraph 2, may be carried out for the quota year in which the request open consultations in accordance with paragraph 2 was made, or for the following year if the quota for the current year is enhausted, where clear evidence of circumvention is provided.
  - Should the parties be unable in the course of consultations to reach a satisfactory solution within the period specified in Article 17 of the Agreement, the Community shall have the right, where clear evidence of circumvention has been provided, to deduct from the quantitative limits established under this Agreement amounts equivalent to the products of Pakistani origin.

#### ARTICLE 13

Le Pakistan shall endeaver to manro that exports of textile products subject to quantitative limits are spaced out as evenly as possible over an agreement year, due account being takes, in particular, of seasonal factore. 2. Should there be an excessive concentration of imports on any product vithin a category subject to quantitative limits mich this Agreement, the Commity may request consultations in accordance with the procedure ipecified in Article 17 of this Agreement with a view to remedying this

#### ARTICLE 14

Should recourse be had to the denunciation provisions of Article 19 paragraph 4, the quantitative limits established in Armex II shall be adapted on a pro rate basis.

#### ARTICLE 15

- For the purpose of the administration of this Agreement, the limits referred to in Article 3 are broken down by the Community into shares for each of its Member States.
- 2. Portions of the quantitative limits established in innex II not used in one Member State of the Community may be reallocated to another Member State in accordance with the procedures in force in the Community;

The Community undertakes to examine with care and reply within four weeks to any request made for reallocation by Pakistan. In the event of agreement on such reallocation, the flexibility provisions set int in Article 7 shall continue to be applicable to the levels of the original allocation.

If, in the course of the application of the Agreement Pakistan finds that the break-down of a limit established in Annex II causes particular difficulties, it may request the opening of consultations in accordance with the provisions of Article 17 with a view to reaching a mutually satisfactory solution.

3. Should it appear in any given region of the Community that additional supplies are required, the Community may, where measures taken pursuant to paragraph 1 above are inadequate to cover those requirements, authorize the importation of amounts greater than those stipulated in Annex II.

#### ARTICLE 15

- Pakistan and the Community undertake to refrain from discrimination in the allocation of export licenses and import authorizations of documents referred to in Protocols A and B.
- 2. In implementing this Agreement, the Contracting Parties shall take care to maintain the traditional commercial practices and trade flows between the Community and Pakistan.
- 3. Should either Party find that the application of this Agreements is disturbing existing commercial relations between importers in the Community and suppliers in Pakistan consultations shall be started promptly, in accordance with the procedure specified in Article 17 of this Agreement, with a view to remedying this situation.

#### ARTICLE 17

- J. The special concultation procedures referred to in this Agreement other than these referred to in paragraph 2 of this Article, shall be governed by the following rules :
  - any request for consultations shall be notified in writing to the other Party;
  - the request for consultations shall be followed within a reasonable period (and in any case not later than fifteen days following the notification) by a statement setting out the reasons and circumstances which, in the opinion of the requesting Party, justify the submission of such a request;
  - the Parties shall enter into consultations within one month at the latest of notification of the request, with a view to reaching agreement or a sutually acceptable conclusion within one further month at the latest.
- 2. The special consultation procedures referred to in inticle 9 of the ignement shall be governed by the following rules :
  - any request for consultations shall be notified in writing to the other Party, together with a statement setting out the reasons and circumstances which, in the opinion of the requesting Party, justify the submission of such a request;
  - the Parties shall enter into consultations within 15 days at the latest of notification of the request, with a view to reaching agreement or a mutually acceptable conlousion within a further 15 days at the latest.
- 3. If necessary, at the request of either of the Parties and in conformity with the provisions of the Geneva Arrangement, consultations shall be held on any problems arising from the application of this Agreement. Any consultations held under this Article shall be approached by both Parties in a spirit of cooperation and with a desire to reconcile the difference between them.

### ARTICLE 18

This Agreement shall apply to the territories within which the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community is applied and under the conditions laid down in that Treaty on the one hand, and to the territory of Pakistan on the other hand.

#### ARTICLE 19

- 1. This Agreement shall enter into force on the first day of the month following the date on which the Contracting Parties notify each other of the completion of the procedures necessary for this purpose. It shall be applicable until 31 December 1986.
- 2. This igneement shall apply with effect from 1 January 1983.
- 3. Either Party may at any time propose modifications to the Agreement.

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- 4. Either Party may at any time denounce this agreement provided that at least sixty days' notice is given. In that event the Agreement shall come to an end on the expiry of the period of notice.
- 5. The innexes and Protocols to this ignement shall form an integral part thereof.

#### ARTICLE 20

This Agreement shall be drawn up in two copies in the Danish, Dutch, English, French, German, Greek, Italian and ... Urdu languages, each . of these texts being equally authentic.

## TITLE I

### CLASSIFICATION

Article 1

- 1. The competent authorities of the Community undertake to inform of any changes in the Common Customs Tariff or NIMEXE before the date of their entry into effect in the Community.
- 2. The competent authorities of the Community undertake to inform of any decisions relating to the classification of products subject to the present Agreement within one month of their adoption at the latest. Such communication shall include :
  - a) a description of the products concerned
  - b) the relevant category, tariff position or sub-position and the Bimers code
  - c) the reasons which have led to the decision.
- 3. Where a decision on classification results in a change of classification practice or a change of category of any product subject to the present Agreement, the competent authorities of the Community shall provide 15 days' notice, from the date of the Community's communication, before the decision enters into effect. Products shipped before the date of entry into effect of the decision shall remain subject to the earlier classification practice, provided that the goods in question are presented for importation into the Community within 60 days of that date.

#### TITLE II

#### ORIGIN

## Article 2

- 1. Products originating in Pakistan for export to the Community in accordance with the arrangements established by this Agreement shall be accompanied by a certificate of Pakistani origin conforming to the model annexed to this Protocol.
- 2. The certificate of origin shall be issued by the competent governmental authorities of Pakistan if the products in question can be considered products originating in that country within the meaning of the relevant rules in force in the Community.
- 3. However, the products in Group III may be imported into the Community in accordance with the arrangements established by this Agreement on production of a declaration by the exporter on the invoice or other commercial document relating to the products to the effect that the products in question originate in Pakistan within the meaning of the relevant rules in force in the Community.
- 4. The certificate of origin referred to in paragraph 1 shall not be required for import of goods covered by a certificate of origin Form A or form APR completed in accordance with the relevant Community rules in order to qualify for generalized tariff preferences.

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Article 3

It is the undertanding of both parties that the certificate of origin shall continue to be issued only on application having been made in writing by the exporter or, under the exporter's responsibility, by his author zed representative. The competent governmental authorities of Pakistan shall con to ensure that the certificate of origin is properly completed and for this purpose they shall call for any necessary documentary evidence or carry out any check which they consider appropriate.

## Article 4

Where different criteria for determining origin are laid down for products falling within the same Category, certificates or declarations of origin shall contain a sufficiently detailed description of the goods to enable the criterion to be determined on the basis of which the certificate was issued or the declaration drawn up.

### Article 5

The discovery of slight discrepancies between the statements made in the certificate of origin and those made in the documents produced to the customs office for the purpose of carrying out the formalities for importingthe product shall not ipso facto cast doubt upon the statements in the certificate.

## TITLE IN

DOUBLE CHECKING SYSTEM FOR CATEGORIES OF PRODUCTS WITH QUANTITATIVE LIMITS

## Section 1

### Exportation

## Article 6

The competent authorities of Pakistan shall issue an export licence in respect of all consignments from Pakistan of textile products referred to in Annex II, up to the relevant quantitative limits as may be modified by Articles 7, 14 and 15 of the Agreement and of textile products subject to any definitive or provisional quantitative limits establishedas a result of the application of Articles 8 and 9 of the Agreement. Article 7

- 1. The export licence shall conform to the model annexed to this Protocol. It must certify inter alia that the quantity of the product in question has been set off against the quantitative limit presecribed for the category of the product in question.
- 2. Each export licence ; shall only cover one of the categories of products listed in Annex II of this Agreement. It may be used for one or more consignments of the products in question.

## Article 8

The competent Community authorities must be notified forthwith of the withdrawal or alteration of any export licence already issued.

## Article g

- I. Exports shall be set off against the quantitative limits established for the year in which shipment of the goods has been effected, even if the export certificate is issued after such shipment.
- 2. For the purposes of applying paragraph 1, shipment of the goods is considered to have taken place on the date of their loading.

## Article 10

The presentation of an export licence, in application of irticle 12 below, shall be effected not later than 31 March of the year following that in which the goods covered by the licence have been shipped.

## Section II

#### Importation

## Article 11

Importation into the Community of textile products subject to quantitative limits shall be subject to the presentation of an import authorization or document.

## Article 12

1. The competent Community authorities shall issue such import authorization or document automatically within five working days of the presentation by the importer of the original. Of the corresponding' export licence.

The import authorization or document shall be valid for six months .

2. The competent Community authorities shall cancel the already issued import authorization or document if the corresponding export licence has been withdrawn.

However, if the competent Community authorities have not been notified about the withdrawal or cancellation of the export licence until after the prod have been imported into the Community, the quantities involved shall be, set off against the quantitative limit for the category and the quota year in question.

## Article 13

- 1. If the competent Community authorities find that the total quantities covered by export certificates issued by Pakistan for a particular category in any Agreement year exceed the quantitative limit established in Annex II for that category, as may be modified by Article 7, 14 and 15 of the Agreement, or any definitive or provisional limit established under Article 8 or 9 of the Agreement, the said authorities may suspend the further issue of import authorisations or documents. In this event, the competent Community authorities shall immediately inform the authorities of Pakistan and the special consultation procedure set out in Article 17. of the Agreement shall be initiated forthwith."
- 2. Exports of Pakistani origin not covered by export licences issued in accordance with the provisions of this Protocol may be refused the issue of import authorizations or documents by the competent Community authorities.

However, if the import of such products are allowed into the Community by the competent Community authorities, the quantities involved shall not be set off against the appropriate quantitative limits set out in Annex II or catablished as a result of the application of Articles 8 or 9 of the Agreement, without the express Agreement of Pakistan.

## TITLE IV

## FORM AND PRODUCTION OF EXPORT CERTIFICATES AND CERTIFICATES OF ORIGIN, AND COMMON PROVISIONS

## Article 14

I. The export licence and the certificate of origin may comprise additional copies duly indicated as such. They shall be made out in English or French. If they are completed by hand, entries must be in link and in printscript.

These documents shall measures 210 x 297 mm. The paper used must be white writing paper, sized, not containing mechanical pulp and weighing not less than 25  $g/m^2$ . Each part shall have a printed guilloche-pattern background making any falsification by mechanical or chemical means apparent to the eye.

If the documents have several copies only the top copy which is the original shall be printed with the guilloche pattern background. This copy shall be clearly marked as "original" and the other copies as "copies". Only the original shall be accepted by the competent authorities in the Community as being valid for the purposes of export to the Community in accordance with the arrangements established by this Agreement.

2. Each document shall bear a standardized serial number, whether or not printed by which it can be identified.

This number shall be composed of the following elements:

- a number indicating the quota year;
- numbers running from 00001 to 99999 allocated to the country of destination
- the numbering system shall also indicate the country of destination (in bo:
   7 of the export licence), country of exportation and issuing office.

## Article 15

The export licence and certificate of origin may be issued after the shipment of the products to which they relate. In such cases they shall bear either the endorsement "delivrée a posteriori" or the endorsement "issued retrospectively".

## Article 16

I. In the event of theft, loss or destruction of an export licence of a certificate of origin, the exporter may apply to the competent governmental authority which issued the document for a duplicate to be made out on the basis of the export documents in his possession. The duplicate of any such certificate or licence so issued shall bear the endorsement "duplicata".

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2. The duplicate must bear the date of the original export - licence or, certificate of origin.

## TITLE V

#### ADDINISTRATIVE COOPERATION

## Article 17

The Community and Pakistan shall cooperate closely to implement the provisions of this Agreement. To this end, contacts and exchanges of views (including on technical matters) shall be facilitated by both parties.

## Article 18

In order to ensure the proper application of this Agreement, the Community and Pakistar shall assist each other in checking the authenticity and accuracy of export licencus and certificates of origin issued or declaration made under this Protocol.

### Article 19

Pakistan shall send the Commission of the European Communities the names and addresses of the governmental authorities competent for the issue and verification of export licences and certificates of origin together with specimens of the stamps used by these authorities. Fakistan shall also notify the Commission of any change in this information.

#### Article 20

- 1. Subsequent verification of certificates of origin or export licences shall be carried out at random, or whenever the competent Community authorities have reasonable doubt as to the authenticity of the certificate or licence or as to the accuracy of the information regarding the products in question.
- 2. In such cases the competent authorities in the Community shall return the certificate of origin or export licence or a copy thereof to the competent governmental authority in Pakistan giving, where appropriate, the reasons of form or substance for an enquiry. If the invoice has been submitted, such invoice or a copy thereof shall be attached to the certificate or licence or its copy. The

authorities shall also forward any information that has been obtained suggesting that the particulars given on the said omtificate or licence are inaccurate.

- 3. The provisions of paragraph 1 above shall be applicable to subsequent verifications of the declarations of origin referred to in Article 2 of this Protocol.
- 4. The results of the subsequent verifications carried out in accordance with paragraphs 1 and 2 above shall be communicated to the competent authorities of the Community within three months at the latest. The information communicated shall indicate whether the disputed pertificants or licence or declaration applies to the goods actually exported and whether these goods are eligible for export in accordance with the arrangements established by this Agreement. The information shall also include, at the request of the Community, copies of all documentation necessary to determine the facts fully and in particular the true origin of the goods.

Should such verifications reveal systematic irregularities in the use of declarations of origin, the Community may subject imports of the products in question to the provisions of Article 2 paragraph 1 of this Protocol.

- 5. For the purpose of subsequent verification of certificates of origin, copies of the certificates as well as any export documents referring to them shall be kept for at lea: period of three years by the competent governmental authority in
- 6. Recourse to the random verification procedure specified in this Article must not constitute an obstacle to the release for home use of the products in question.

Article 21

- 1. Where the verification procedure referred to in Article 4 or where information available to the Community or to Pakistan indicates or appears to indicate that the provisions of this Agreement are being contravened, both parties shall cooperate closely and with the appropriate urgency to prevent such contravention.
- 2. To this end, Pakistan shall, on its own initiative or at the request of th Community, carry out appropriate enquiries or arrange for such enquiries to be carried out concerning operations which are or appear to the Community to be in contravention of this Agreement. Pakistan shall communicate the results of these enquiries to the Community together with any other pertinent information enabling the true origin of the goods to be determined.

- 3. By agreement between the Community and Pakistani officials designated by the Community may be present at the enquiries referred to in paragraph 2.
- 4. In pursuance of the cooperation referred to in paragraph 1, Pakistan and the Community shall exchange any information considered by either partner to be of use in preventing the contravention of the provisions of this Agreement. Such information may include information on trade in products subject to this Agreement between Pakistan and other countries and information on production of such products in Pakistan.
- 5. Where it is established that the provisions of this Agreement have been contravened, Pakistan and the Community may agree to take such measures as are necessary to prevent a recurrence of such contravention.

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## PROTOCOL 8

- The exemption provided for in Article 5 of the Agreement in respect of cottage industry products shall apply only to the following products:
  - (a) fabrics woven on hand-or foot-operated looms, being fabrics of a kind traditionally made in the cottage industry of
  - (b) hand-made cottage industry products made of the handloom fabrics described in (a);
  - (c) traditional folklore textile products of Pakistan . made by ... hand in the cottage industry of Pakistan as defined in a list to be agreed between both Parties and annexed to this Protocol

Exemption shall be granted only for products accompanied by a certificate issued by the competent Pakistani authorities in accordance with the specimen annexed to this Protocol. Such certificates shall state the grou (ommunity on which exemption is based and shall be accepted by the competent Gommor Concessing ty authorities provided that they are satisfied that the products concern Coverino conform to the conditions set out in this Protocol. Certificates coveri the products referred to in paga (c) above shall bear a conspicuous stamp Competent-"FOLKLORE". In case of divergent opinion between Pakistan and the compile: Community authorities at the point of entry into the Community as to the nature of such products, consultations shall be held within one month wit a view to resolving such divergences. Should imports of any of the above products reach such proportions as to cause difficulties to the Community the two Parties shall open consultations forthwith in accordance with the procedure laid down in Article 17 of the Agreement with a view to finding a quantitative solution to the problem.

2. The provisions of Title IV and V of Protocol & shall apply "mutatis mutar to the products referred to in paragraph 1.

#### AGREED LIST OF TRADITIONAL FOLKLORE HANDICRAFT TEXTILE PRODUCTS OF PAKISTAN

#### List of traditional folklore handicraft textile products of Pakistan agreed between the Community and Pakistan according to subparagraph (c) of Protocol B

Products listed below are indicated by Pakistan as being uniquely and historically traditional folklore textile products made by hand in the cottage industry of Pakistan.

1. DUPATTA

Long scarf about four feet or more long and three feet or more wide of thin conton fabric with colourful design worn by women to cover the head.

2. GHILAF

Embruidered decorative tubular case open at both ends with drawstring enclosures.

3. IZARBAND

Cotton belt in multicoloured continuous lengths of unwoven threads,

#### 4. SHISHA EMBROIDERED BALUCHI SHIRT OR DRESS

Traditional mirror embroidery on plain, printed or striped material, worn by the people of Sindla and Baluchistan. Short, medium or long according to the areas from which they come.

#### 5. CIMMARBAND

Antique and embroidered wide beits worn around the waist, with heavy mirrored embroidery.

#### 6. QUEITA JACKETS

Loose vest worn over kurta by men and women. Made either of printed material or of embrowdered material with mirror on plain colours.

7. AJRAN KAFTAN (MAXI)

Traditional Sindhi printed dress of ankle length (blue and red prints), worn by women in the Sindh region. Ajrak short dress/shirts are also worn by men in this area.

#### 8. PUSIFFOON STAR KHAT

Cotton printed, dyed or plain long dress, ankle length with extra wide or simple sleeves. Women of North-West Frontier Province wear this dress.

9. BURQA

 Loose tunic or dress with hood attached, worn by Isdies when going out of the house. Worn as an outer covering and often gaily embroidered or handprinted.

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#### 10. MULTANI CHOLI

Short bodice with or without sleeves.

#### 11. EMBROIDERED KURTA-SHIRT

Type of shirt or loose tunic worn throughout Pakistan over loose trousers. Embroidered in different colours. Adapted from Angarkha by King Ahmad Shah Abdali. Worn short or long: triangular inserts at the armpits.

#### 12. SINDHI KAMEEZ (SHIRT)

Cotton, plain dyed and hand printed shirt with extra wide sleeves (long) worn with shalwar by women in Sindh.

#### 13. PESHAWARI WAISTCOAT

Small jacket type of dress worn over kameez (shirt) by the women and men in the North-West Frontier Province. Heavily embroidered with or without mirror and golden embroidery.

#### H. MOHENJODARO JULABA/SINDHI SHIRT

Short or full-length printed dress worn with shalwar (trousers), mostly by men and women in the areas of Mohenjodaro valley.

#### 15. MULTANI KURTA-SHIRT

Crocher worked short or long tunic worn by the peasants in Panjab. Crocheted work located at the neck and front; triangular inserts at the armpits.

#### 16. RILLI KURTA-SHIRT

Kurta (shirt) of heavy fabric patchworked decorations appliqued by hand, worn by women of Sindh.

#### 17. SINDHI JULABA

Very loose ankle-length dress in handloom or hand-blocked material with a hook attached at lower part. Extending to lowest hem. Worn in the villages of Sindh. Can also be embroidered.

#### 18. BATWA

Drawstring pouches, bags, purses or a string bag. Gaily printed or hand-embroidered or with mirrors or made with coloured strings.

#### 19. SWATI SMOCKING DRESS

Large and short dress with or without sleeves (margon colour), worn with smocking by the ladies of Swat and other areas of North-West Frontier Province.

#### 20. BALUCHI KAMEEZ (SHIRT)

Embroidered top worn by the women of Baluchistan over shalwar or Turkish trousers. Flared runic with extra wide sleeves tapering to a buttoned cuff.

#### 21. COTTON EMBROIDERED KAFTAN

Kaftan in the traditional embroidery of Multan, Makran, Dera Ghazi Khan and Nuchki — long, looke-fitting dress with embroidery around top and bottom with side slits of about 28 inches to the lower hem.

#### 22. GHAGRA

Ankle-length, loose-fitting skirt with drawstring around the waist or hooks, worn with either a fitted or loose choli (blouse), with traditional colours embroidered or hand-printed. Worn in the Tharparker area of Sindh.

## PROTOCOL D

The annual growth rate for the quantitative limits introduced under Article 8 of the Agreement shall be determined as follows :

for products in categories falling within Group I, II, III, the growth rate shall be fixed by agreement between the Parties in accordance with the consultation procedure established in Article 17 of the Agreement. Such growth rate may in no case be lower than the highest rate applied to corresponding products under bilateral agreements concluded under the Geneva Arrangement between the Community and other third countries having a level of trade equal to or comparable with that of Pakistan.

#### AGREED MINUTE

Delegations of the European Economic Community and of Pakistan met on 17, 18, 19, 20 and 21 May to negotiate the renewal of the bilateral textile agreement which expires on 31 December 1982.

These negotiations led to the initialling of an agreement on 21 May. On this occasion, the following was also agreed:

- (i) <u>Carryover</u> to the quantitative limits for the year 1983 of amounts not used during the year 1982 is authorized up to % of the corresponding quantitative limits for 1983.
- (ii) If the provisions of Art. 8 of the Agreement initialled on 21 May 1982 are invoked in respect of <u>category 7</u> by the Community, the Community will take into account the quantitative limits existing in respect of this category under the bilateral textile agreement expiring on 31 December 1982. The Community will also provide a separate and additional quantitative limit in respect of Outward Processing Trade in this category if so requested by Pakistan, the level of this limit to be negotiated between the two Parties.

#### AGREED MINUTE

- L. In the course of negotiations for the renewal of the bilateral textile agreement which expires on 31 December 1982, held on 17, 18, 19, 20 and 21 May 1982, the delegation of Pakistan declared Pakistan's interest in developing Outward Processing Trade with the Community.
- 2. In this connection, and pursuant to Article 4 of the bilateral textile agreement between the Community and Pakistan, the parties agreed that the complementary provisions essential for the implementation of Outward Processing Trade between the Community and Pakistan should be set out in a separate arrangement between the parties.
- 3. Fending settlement of the detailed management questions of the arrangement referred to in Paragraph 2, the Community and Pakistan agreed that the following additional quantities should form part of that arrangement.

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The Pakistan Mission is pleased to confirm the Government of Pakistan's agreement to the application of the Textile Agreement de facto from Ist January, 1983. The Government of Pakistan also agree to the changes in Protocol A replacing 15 days notice by 30 days notice in Title 1 Article 1 para 3 and further agree to adding phrase:

"On the exporting aircraft, vehicle or vessel" after the word 'loading' at the end of para 2 Article 9 Title III of Protocol A.

The Government of Pakistan also agrees to changing the percentage from 1 per cent to 2.5 per cent in Article 9 para 5 of the Agreement.

The Mission of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan avails itself of this opportunity to renew to the Directorate-General for External Relations the assurance of its higher consideration.
