- 1. An actual user (industrial) holding an automatic licence can, however, import within the value of the licence, limited permissible items as are needed for the manufacturing process upto a value of Rs. 1,50,000 for a single item provided the total of all items imported does not exceed 1% of the value of the licence. Supplementary licences may also be obtained in case of need.
- 2. Registered Exporters are permitted to obtain Import Replenishment (REP) licences which are valid for importation from any source of limited permissible items, banned items and canalised items necessary for the production of the particular export products.
- 3. India's import restrictions on textiles, along with restrictions on other imports are maintained for balance of payments reasons. Details of various measures are described in the Import Policy of India published annually by the Department of Commerce, Government of India.
