## STATISTICS ON TEXTILES AND CLOTHING

### Part 2: Production, Employment, Value Added and Investment, 1973-1979

#### Introduction

The statistics which have been compiled for the major review are circulated in three parts: Part 1 (document COM.TEX/W/76) contains summarized statistics on output, employment and trade in textiles and clothing. Part 3 (document COM.TEX/W/78) contains detailed trade statistics.

The tables attached herewith refer to production, employment, value added and investment as reported by the members of the Arrangement in reply to the questionnaires issued under the Textiles Committee's statistical reporting scheme. The data are grouped on a country-by-country basis. For each reporting member, the first table shows the development of production of selected textile and clothing products between 1973 and 1979 (or 1980 if available), the second table (available for certain countries only) compares production and trade for those products for which a concordance could be established; finally, the last two tables refer to employment, value added and investment in the textile and clothing industries.

### EXPLANATORY NOTES

The data on output, employment, value added and investment are based on replies to questionnaires and incorporate revisions and amendments received in reply to the secretariat requests. The data on trade are based on those shown in Part 3 (document COM.TEX/W/76), supplemented by data obtained from national trade returns. Detailed definitions and explanations as provided by the reporting members are given at the end of this volume.

As may be seen from these notes, the degree of inter-country comparability is limited, mainly because of the different definitions and methods of data collection employed at the national level. For example, production data either refer to total output or to manufacturers' shipments. They are generally collected from manufacturing establishments, but depending on the scope of the survey, establishments below a certain size or those principally engaged in other activities are not always included. As a result, the figures reported may seriously understate the actual output of the textile and clothing sectors since both the production of "secondary" products by firms classified outside the industry and the output of small establishments not covered by the surveys may represent a non-negligible part of total production. Also, experience in manufacturing censuses shows that comprehensive coverage cannot be achieved even if industrial surveys are directed to all registered establishments. In addition, for the apparel sector, available information seems to point out that output of the small establishments increased during the last decade. If this is the case, the statistics may also, in the long run, understate the growth of clothing output. It will also be noted that the definitions of the products reported (especially with respect to fibre content) as well as the quantity units employed differ between countries.

Employment data are generally collected from establishments, from population surveys or from social insurance records and can therefore differ widely in coverage. In addition different treatment is applied by countries in reporting homeworkers, unpaid family workers, active business partners and the like.

In addition, an attempt was made to relate the production figures for the textile and clothing articles provided under the reporting scheme with the available import and export data. The difficulties associated with compiling for each country comparable trade and production statistics by product proved to be formidable. In the first instance it proved difficult (if not impossible) to match the production with the trade statistics in the absence of precise product definitions of the output data reported by the members. Second, it could not be established that the coverage of the production data was fully comparable with that of the trade data. While the trade statistics can be assumed to cover all the products entering international trade, the same cannot be said for the production statistics for the reasons already mentioned in paragraph 2 above. As a result of these

difficulties the production/trade comparison was limited to a few countries only and the resulting statistics should be treated with caution.

The following definitions have been used:

Textile industry - ISIC<sup>1</sup> major group 321. This includes spinning, weaving and finishing; the manufacture of made-up textile goods except wearing apparel; knitting mills; the manufacture of carpets and rugs; cordage rope and twine industries; and the manufacture of textiles not elsewhere specified. All textile fibres are included.

Clothing industry - ISIC<sup>1</sup> major group 322 - the manufacture of wearing apparel, except footwear. All textile fibres are included.

All manufacturing industries - ISIC<sup>1</sup> major division 3 - manufacturing.

Employment in the textile and clothing industries

Employees - all persons engaged, including working proprietors, active business partners, unpaid family workers, regular employees, but excluding homeworkers.

Production workers - wage earners directly engaged in production and related activities of the establishment.



Value added and investment in the textile and clothing industries

Value added - current value of gross output less the cost of materials, fuels and other supplies consumed; contract and commission work done by others; repair and maintenance work done by others; goods shipped in the same condition as received, and electricity consumed.

Investment - current value of purchases and own account construction of new and used fixed assets less the value of corresponding sales.

Departures from the definitions listed above have been noted at the end of this volume (see country notes page 100) and should be taken into account when making inter-country comparisons.

Lines have been suppressed where data are not available. Only countries reporting data have been included.
