Bilateral Agreement between Spain and the United States

Addendum

Attached are notes amending the bilateral agreement concluded between the Governments of the United States and Spain relating to trade in cotton textiles.

The Embassy of Spain presents its compliments to the United States Department of State and in compliance with the provisions of paragraph 5 of the Bilateral Agreement of 30 October 1964, concerning cotton textile exports from Spain to the United States, has the honour to inform the Department, that the Spanish Government prefers not to propose a breakdown for Category 62 at this time in view of the fact that Spain's export possibilities in that category are very limited. However, should export possibilities develop during the life of the Agreement, the Spanish Government will propose to the United States Government the required breakdown for Category 62. As for Category 64, the Spanish Government would like to include in the text of the Agreement a note mentioning that exports from Spain to the United States of Nottingham cotton lace goods will be limited to the equivalent of 500,000 square yards for the first year of the Agreement.

The acknowledgement of this note with confirmation of the fact that this proposal is agreeable to the United States Government, will be considered as an amendment to the bilateral agreement.

The Embassy of Spain avails itself of this opportunity to renew to the Department of State the expression of its highest consideration.
