Addendum

Attached are exchanged notes amending the bilateral arrangement concluded between the Governments of the Republic of China and the United States concerning trade in cotton textiles.

This information has been transmitted to the secretariat by the Governments concerned for notification to the Cotton Textiles Committee.

Excellency,

I have the honour to refer to the recent discussions between representatives of our Governments concerning the adjustment of the ceiling on category 6 (ginghams, combed) and the establishment of a specific ceiling for category 25 (yarn-dyed fabrics, except ginghams, combed) under the provisions of the United States-Chinese bilateral agreement concerning trade in cotton textiles, done at Taipei on 19 October 1963, as amended.

I am pleased to inform you that the Government of the United States agrees to the increase of the export ceiling for category 6 from the present level of 377,784 square yards to a new level of 600,000 square yards for the second year of the agreement commencing 1 October 1964. The United States Government also agrees to establish a ceiling of 750,000 square yards for category 25 for the second year of the agreement. These ceilings would, of course, be subject to the provisions of paragraphs 1 and 2 of the agreement with respect to overall and group ceilings and to the provisions of paragraph 6 of the agreement in regard to growth during ensuing twelve-month periods.

If these proposals are acceptable to your Government, this note and Your Excellency's note in reply on behalf of the Government of the Republic of China shall constitute an amendment to the agreement of 19 October 1963.
