LONG-TERM ARRANGEMENT REGARDING INTERNATIONAL TRADE IN COTTON TEXTILES

Bilateral Arrangement between Canada and Japan¹

The following communication has been received by the Director-General from the Canadian mission for notification to the Cotton Textiles Committee.

I have the honour to inform you that in a bilateral arrangement pursuant to Article 4 of the Long-Term Arrangement Regarding International Trade in Cotton Textiles, Canada and Japan have agreed on the following restraint levels to be applied by Japan on exports to Canada during the calendar year 1965. You will note that these restraint levels generally provide for increases of 3 per cent over the 1964 levels.
