Bilateral Arrangement Between Canada and Japan

Addendum

The following communication has been received by the Director-General from the Canadian mission for notification to the Cotton Textiles Committee.

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I have the honour to advise you that Canada has concluded an arrangement with Japan for the year 1968 concerning the restraints on exports of certain cotton textiles from Japan to Canada. I attach a copy of the relevant information for circulation to the members of the Cotton Textiles Committee.

on Exports of Certain Cotton Textile Products to Canada  
for the Calendar Year 1968

Blouses	212,100 dozen
Sport shirts	208,060 dozen
Dress and work shirts	70,700 dozen
Trousers and outer shorts	124,630 dozen
Outerwear	245,500 dozen
Pillowcases	221,450 dozen
Sheets	789,000 pieces
Fabrics	31,714,000 square yards

(Within the overall quota for fabrics, dyed corduroy may not exceed 2,020,000 square yards.)
