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ARRANGEMENT REGARDING INTERNATIONAL TRADE IN COTTON TEXTILES

Action by the United States under Articles 3 and 6(c)

Addendum

The following communication has been received by the Director-General from the United States mission for notification to the Cotton Textiles Committee.

On 26 March 1970 the United States Government, under the provisions of the Long-Term Arrangement involving non-Long-Term Arrangement members, renewed the restraint on imports from the Hungarian People's Republic¹, exported during the twelve-month period which began 1 April 1970 in Category 19 (print cloth, other than 80 x 80 carded), at a level of 525,000 square yards. On 24 March 1970 the United States Government renewed the restraint on imports from the Hungarian People's Republic, exported during the twelve-month period, which began 25 March 1970 in Category 26 other than duck (fabrics, n.e.s. carded) at a level of 352,800 square yards. These levels reflected a 5 per cent increase over the previous year's levels.
