## Note on Statistics by the Secretariat

1. At its meeting in November 1962 (see document COT/M/2, paragraph 11) the Committee agreed, with reference to basic statistics, that:

- (a) three questionnaires based on the recommendations of the Statistical Sub-Committee should be sent to governments by the secretariat;
- (b) the replies received from individual governments on a monthly, quarterly or annual basis should be distributed by the secretariat as and when they are received;
- (c) the secretariat should consolidate and issue statistics on a quarterly and on an annual basis;
- (d) the statistics already supplied by governments to the secretariat in connexion with the Short-Term Arrangement should be distributed by the secretariat without delay.

The questionnaires were subsequently distributed as document COT/W/8. As can be seen from the attached summaries, not all the participating countries have responded to the questionnaires. The larger part of the information received has been transmitted only during recent weeks.

2. Up to now, most of the replies to the questionnaires have been submitted to the secretariat with a considerable time lag. Moreover, the data supplied were often incomplete and not always readily comparable between countries. For these reasons, the secretariat has not circulated to the members of the Committee the statistics received, but has kept them available to the members of the Committee for consultation in the secretariat. Similar considerations have kept the secretariat from circulating the statistics supplied under the Short-Term Arrangement which were submitted by only four countries.

3. With rather few data at hand, it has evidently not been possible for the secretariat to consolidate and issue statistics as referred to in point (c) above.

4. It is obvious that the Committee's statistical programme can only be meaningful if a large majority of the participating countries will be able to transmit regularly and without great delay most of the data requested in the questionnaires, which include what was envisaged by the Statistical Sub-Committee as essential information for the Cotton Textiles Committee to have available for the discharge of its functions (see document L/1717). 5. It appears from the replies to the questionnaires and comments made by several participating countries that certain countries have encountered difficulties in supplying some of the information requested. This has been the case in particular with respect to data on cotton clothing and certain made-up articles (other than household) of cotton, which in most national statistical compilations cannot be easily distinguished from these made of other fibres. As far as these two groups are concerned, the problem has already been considered by the Statistical Sub-Committee which - being aware that changes in the system of compilation of national statistics necessarily must take time - recommended that, as a temporary measure, figures for trade in these groups could cover all fibres. In addition, however, estimates should be furnished of the part represented by cotton. In making such estimates, the participation of national agencies which are not directly engaged in compilation of statistics might be necessary. To avoid unnecessary delays in the submission of the data currently available, the estimates might be supplied separately and less frequently.

6. Apart from difficulties encountered in connexion with the specified commodity groups, the compilation of certain parts of the statistics has been considered by some countries as requiring a very substantial amount of work, particularly in connexion with the monthly trade data requested in Questionnaire No. 1. This is obviously the case if these statistics are not produced on data processing machinery within the framework of the regular processing of national trade returns. As a certain time may be required before such a programme can be incorporated into the normal activities of the national data processing agencies, the consolidation of statistics by the secretariat mentioned under (c) in paragraph 1 above might for the time being be based on quarterly submissions. As regards the data on trade analyzed by provenance and destination, the system of reporting might be simplified by limiting the number of countries included.

7. If the Committee regards it as helpful, the secretariat could regularly send out enquiry forms with a standard lay-out, which would also serve as a reminder. It would also be useful and time-saving if the secretariat could have direct contact with the national statisticians responsible for the compilation in the participating countries, an arrangement which is already established with some participating countries. If experience shows that a major round of consultations would be needed a meeting of the Statistical Sub-Committee could be called.

8. Having regard to the Committee's needs for comprehensive and up to date documentation, all participating countries should endeavour to transmit the necessary data with the shortest possible delay. The secretariat would then be able to consolidate the data received and circulate a statistical paper to the Committee, tentatively on a quarterly basis.
