TORQUAY PROTOCOL

The Secretary-General of the United Nations has advised that the Torquay Protocol was signed on 30 June 1953 by the Government of Nicaragua.¹ No schedule for Nicaragua was annexed to the Protocol.

By virtue of paragraph 7 (c) of the Torquay Protocol, the above signature constitutes an acceptance, effective on 30 June, of the following instruments which had hitherto not been signed or accepted by the Government of Nicaragua:

Fifth Protocol of Rectifications,²

First Protocol of Rectifications and Modifications,

Second Protocol of Rectifications and Modifications.

¹ By a decision of the CONTRACTING PARTIES of 20 February 1953 (Document L/77) the time limit for signature of the Torquay Protocol by Nicaragua was extended to 30 June 1953.

² As a consequence of Nicaragua's signature of the Torquay Protocol, this Protocol entered into force on 30 June 1953.
