Corrigendum

Page 1

In the footnote the reference to "Annex D" should read "Annex C".

Page 4

Paragraph 12

The paragraph should read as follows:

"The Six are important in world cocoa trade. Taking the average of 1955 and 1956 figures they accounted for about 32 per cent of total world imports as compared with 15 per cent for the United Kingdom and 34 per cent for the United States".

Page 5

Paragraph 19

In the last sentence the words "cocoa beans" should be replaced by "cocoa products".

Page 6

Paragraph 21

At the end of the second sentence delete "in August 1954 and 1956" and add "...in June 1954 the price was 70.6 cents and in April 1956 25.8 cents"

Page 8

Paragraph 29

In the last line "smaller" should read "small".

Page 14

Paragraph 43

The beginning of the third sentence should read as follows: "A large part of the present sales of the A.O.T's to third countries...etc."

In the fourth sentence delete the words "for those countries".

Paragraph 44

In the fourth sentence delete the words "and in some cases as high as 40 per cent".

Page 16

Paragraph 50

The first sentence and the beginning of the second sentence should read as follows: "Representatives of producing countries other than the Six noted that most serious of all, were the adverse effects on world cocoa prices which they foresaw. As noted on Part Two the cocoa market was a highly sensitive one and experience since the war...etc."

Page 18

Paragraph 55

In the second sentence delete "high" from the expression "...appreciable high Common Market tariff...".

Page 19

Paragraph 57

Sub-paragraph (b) should begin as follows: "France could remove its quotas...etc."

Page 21

Paragraph 64

The end of the first sentence should read: "...production in the A.O.T's would also find a sheltered market there, thus forcing out the products of third countries".

The fourth and fifth sentences of this paragraph should be deleted.
