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AUSTRALIAN TARIFF PREFERENCES FOR DEVELOPING COUNTRIES

Second Annual Report by the Government of Australia under the Decision of 28 March 1966

1. Pursuant to the Decision of the CONTRACTING PARTIES of 28 March 1966, Australia introduced a system of tariff preferences for developing countries on the manufactures, semi-manufactures and handicraft products listed in the annex to that Decision.
2. On 12 April 1966, provision for unlimited duty-free admission of the handicraft products concerned was introduced. On the same day, importers were invited to apply for quota certificates for the importation, at preferential tariff rates, of products listed in the annex as being subject to quota control. The quota certificates were to be issued between 1 July and 31 December 1966, and were to cover imports with total f.o.b. values not exceeding half the level of each annual quota provided for in the waiver. Importers to whom certificates were issued were permitted to import the products concerned at any time within twelve months from 1 July 1966.
3. On 19 September 1966, applications were invited for quota certificates to be issued during the second half of the first quota year for preferential imports up to the value of the remaining half of each annual quota provided for in the annex, plus any unallocated portion of the quota made available during the first half of the quota year. Importers to whom allocations were made were permitted to import the products concerned at any time within twelve months from 1 January 1967.
4. In the same way, invitations have been extended to importers before the beginning of each subsequent half year. In each case, however, account has been taken of increases in the scope of the system which have been made effective upon completion of the notification and consultation procedures laid down in the Decision. The relevant notifications are those which were circulated in documents L/2793 of 19 May 1967; L/2793/Add.1 of 15 June 1967; L/2832 of 7 August 1967; L/2922 of 22 November 1967; L/2971 of 2 February 1968; L/2974 of 14 February 1968; L/2982 of 26 February 1968; L/3038 of 5 July 1968; and L/3061 of 28 August 1968. Apart from reductions in some of the preferential rates of duty and increases in the product coverage of many of the quotas, the total value of the quotas available has been progressively increased until, at the present time, it stands at approximately \$26.6 million per annum - or double the initial total of approximately \$13.3 million per annum. Additionally, the number of types of handicraft product admissible at the preferential duty-free rate has been increased considerably. In all cases, the goods concerned have been nominated by developing countries as being of export interest to them.

5. All allocations of quota are made without discrimination between applicant importers or eligible countries of origin.

6. Paragraphs 4 and 5 of the Decision of the CONTRACTING PARTIES provides for consultations with any contracting party which considers that action taken or proposed by Australia under the Decision is causing or threatens substantial injury to its trade with Australia in the relevant goods. The only such requests which have so far been received have been two from the United Kingdom on behalf of Hong Kong. In each case, the request concerned the exclusion of Hong Kong from particular preferences. In both cases, the consultations were satisfactorily concluded and contracting parties were advised of the outcome in documents L/2832 and L/2971.

7. Annexed to this report are tables of statistics on the allocation of preferential quotas and on import clearances, from all sources, of products of the type to which the preferential quotas apply. The tables cover the two-year period 1966/67 to 1967/68. In the case of import clearances, figures for 1965/66 are included for purposes of comparison.

8. Annex A shows the total value of allocations made during each of the six-monthly periods involved, in respect of each of the product quotas in force at the time. Annex B shows the total allocations for each of the developing countries nominated by applicant importers as the intended source of supply. Annex C shows the f.o.b. value of imports actually cleared under the tariff item(s) to which each quota applied. Annex D shows the total sourcing of these imports, and of preferential duty-free imports of handicraft products, from particular developing countries.

9. In the column headed "Quota Group" in Annexes A and C, the tariff item shown in each case is either the item to which a separate quota applies or, if more than one item shares a single quota, the first of the group of items sharing the quota. The figures which appear opposite each of the tariff items shown, however, represent the totals of the allocations of clearances applicable to the item or items to which each quota applies.

10. The statistics relate only to the preferences which were in operation prior to 1 July 1968. They do not include, for instance, the products added to the system with effect from 1 July 1968, in accordance with the announcement of Australia's Minister for Trade and Industry at the Second United Nations Conference on Trade and Development (L/2974).

11. It will be seen that for the period covered by the statistics, both quota allocations and import clearances at the special preferential rates available have been increasing rapidly. It is also evident, however, that there remains considerable scope for developing countries to take greater advantage of the opportunities provided by the system.

12. As stated in the last annual report on the operation of the system, all requests for the inclusion of further products within the system have been or are being carefully considered and it remains the intention of the Australian Government to seek to further assist developing countries by improving the operation and progressively widening the scope of the system.
