ADMINISTRATIVE AND FINANCIAL QUESTIONS

Financial Position as at 30 September 1969

Note by the Director-General

- 1. In accordance with paragraph 3 of the Resolution approved by the CONTRACTING PARTIES on 14 November 1965, the Director-General herewith reports on the status of budgetary expenditure over the first nine months of 1969. This report further contains information as at 30 September 1969 on the status of budgetary income, accounts receivable and the Working Capital Fund.
- 2. The final position for the financial year 1969 regarding any appropriations of savings, transfers of credits between sections of the budget or advances from the Working Capital Fund will be reported as soon as possible after the closure of the financial year.

I. BUDGETARY EXPENDITURE

- 3. The appropriations for 1969, authorized by the CONTRACTING PARTIES, were \$3,364,500. In addition, credits of \$67,000 were authorized to cover the additional cost arising from the increase in the salary scales of the professional category and above. A further credit of \$29,000 has been requested to cover the additional cost arising from the increase in the general service category salary scales effective 1 January and 1 November 1969, as well as the cost of the revised dependency rates for general service category staff effective 1 July 1969.
- 4. Disbursements up to 30 September 1969 amounted to \$2,332,431.
- 5. Total 1969 budgetary expenditure as at 31 December 1969 is estimated at \$3,365,000 and it is therefore expected that, at the close of the financial year, total appropriations, including the unforeseen expenditure item, will have been used.

II. BUDGETARY INCOME

6. Income received up to the end of September 1969 amounted to 95.08 per cent of the income budget. The corresponding figure was 90.61 per cent in 1968.

^{7.} Miscellaneous income is now estimated at \$136,000. The estimated excess income is mainly due to increased income from investments as a consequence of high interest rates obtained on short-term investments and early collection of contributions.

- 9. The following contributions have been received by the secretariat since 30 September 1969: \$23,800 from Argentina; \$27,610 from Brazil; \$5,609 from Dominican Republic; \$11,740 from Israel; and \$3,357 from Upper Volta. The following Governments have advised the secretariat that their contributions will be remitted shortly: Burundi, Central African Republic, Dominican Republic (\$12,350), and India.
- 10. Miscellaneous accounts receivable as at 30 September 1969 amount to \$59,498. Of this amount outstanding invoices in respect of sales of publications and other services rendered, issued in 1967 and earlier, total \$3,576.

IV. WORKING CAPITAL FUND

- 11. At 30 September 1969 the principal of the Working Capital Fund stood at \$358,874.
