Tariff Alignment and Negotiations under Article XXIV:6

Addendum

The following communication, dated 8 June 1970, has been received from the permanent delegation of Greece.

With reference to the note by the GATT secretariat circulated in document L/3363 of 4 March 1970, and further to my letter dated 27 May 1970 (No. 623)¹ I have the honour, upon instructions from my Government, to communicate the following:

1. The Greek customs tariff in force in 1960 was translated and published in 1961 by the International Customs Tariff Bureau at Brussels.
2. That tariff was subsequently amended and supplemented, in pursuance of Legislative Ordinance No. 4257 of 24 October 1962. The amendments introduced by that Ordinance were included in the First Supplement to No. 20 (seventh edition) of the above-mentioned Brussels Bureau.
3. Numerous tariff changes were introduced on 1 November 1965 in the 1960 customs tariff, as a consequence of the first alignment of the Greek customs tariff towards the common customs tariff. Those changes have been published, and appear in the Second Supplement to No. 20 (seventh edition) of the Brussels Bureau.
4. Thereafter, the 1960 customs tariff was revised in order that the specifications and terminology should agree to the fullest extent possible with the specifications and terminology of the common customs tariff. This new revised Greek tariff came into effect on 1 May 1970. It also includes the new tariffs resulting from the application on that date of the second alignment of the Greek customs tariff towards the common customs tariff, in accordance with the provisions of Article 20 of the Agreement of Association between Greece and the European Community.
5. This new revised Greek customs tariff will be communicated shortly to the International Customs Tariff Bureau at Brussels, for translation and publication in accordance with standard procedures.
