## SUBSIDIES

### Notifications Pursuant to Article XVI:1

#### Addendum

#### SOUTH AFRICA

This notification brings up to date South Africa's full reply on subsidies contained in L/3178/Add.13 of 21 January 1970.

#### I. FERTILIZERS

##### 1. (b) Incidence

The second paragraph should read as follows:

No direct subsidies, as in the case of fertilizers, are payable on farm manure, compost and agricultural lime, but a rebate, amounting to 75 per cent (with a maximum of R 2 per ton) for agricultural lime and 50 per cent (with a maximum of R 1 per ton) for farm manure and compost, is payable by the Treasury on the railage and/or railway administration road transport charges.

#### II. FOODSTUFFS

##### 1. (b) (ii) Maize

The second sentence of the first paragraph should be replaced by the following:

Producer prices are annually determined by the Board, subject to Government approval, with due regard to the supply and demand position, the returns to producers and the general objective of the scheme to afford price stability to producers of maize as far as possible.

#### III. FILMS

##### 1. (b) Incidence

The second sub-paragraph numbered (ii) should be replaced by the following:

(ii) a payment of 44 per cent is made in respect of the amount by which the gross income on any film exceeds R 50,000. In the case of films, released since 1 October 1969, of which at least 95 per cent of the dialogue is in the Afrikaans language, the subsidy has been increased to 55 per cent.
