# GENERAL AGREEMENT ON <br> TARIFFS AND TRADE 

## PESTRICTTONS ON TMPORTS FROM POLAND

## Notifications by Contracting Parties

1. Contracting parties were invited in airgram GATT/AIR/812 of 28 July 1970 to notify by 15 September 1970 for the purpose of item (i)(c) of the plan for the annual review of Poland ${ }^{\prime \prime}$ trade with contracting parties ${ }^{1}$, action taken under paragraph 3 of the Protocol. for the Accession of Poland to remove remaining quantitative restrictions on imports from Poland.
2. The Council at its meeting on 28 April 1970 approved guidelines for the form and content of the notifications. These guidelines were reproduced in GATT/AIR/812.
3. Notifications have been received from the following Governments:

## FUROPEAN ECONOMIC CONMUNITY

In connexion with the third annual review under article 5 of the Protocol for the Accession of Poland to GATT, and in response to your request of 28 July 1970, $\tau$ have the honour to forward herewith lists of products still subject to quantitative restrictions when iuported from Poland. Tiese products are designated by full heading number of the Comon Customs Tarifis of the Comunity. The lists have been drawn up in accordance with the guidelines approved by the Council on 28 April 1970, and supplement the information fumished previously (document L/3241/Add. 3 of 5 Moveinber 1959).

The attached lists also indicate the value of inports of products which were still subject to quantitative restrictions. Lastly, the recapitulation table shows : substantial decline in the number of quantitative restrictions still maintained, and also indicates that there hes been an increase in the overall value of imports of products still subject to these restrictions.

## GREECE

Further to my letter of 12 Decenber 1969 (L/3241/Add.5), I have the honour to forward to you herewith statistics of trade between Greece and Foland during the years 1967, 1968 and 1959: these statistics which are arrenged by SITC section have been furnished by the Greek National Statistical Service.

It will be noted that exports under section 2 show a substantial incresse in 1969 over the corresponding figures for 1968; this is attributeble to a slowing dow in cotton export shipments in 1968, and these are, therefore, included in the statistics for 1969.

In viey of the fact thet these statistics do not entirely tally with the corresponding figures in document $I / 3399$ of 1 June 1570, I an instructed by the appropriate Greek authorities to give the following explanation:

Differences between the Polish and Greek statistics are attributable to the fact that on the Greek side the valuation of products imported from Foland is in terms of the c.i.f. price, and on the other hend to the time lag between consignment of goods and their arrival at the port of destination. Goods are recorded. by the Greek statistical services only after arrival.

As regards Greek exports to Poland in 1969, for which the valuation is in terms of the f.o.b. price and which show a substantial increase under section 2 , it should be noted that suistartial exports of Greek cotton took place in November and December 1969, and these may not have been recorded in the statistics for that year of Poland's imports from Greece.
