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## IUSTRALILN TARIFF PREFERENCES FOR DEVELOPING COUNTRIES <br> Fourth innual Report by the Government of iustralia under the Decision of 28 March 1966

1. Pursuant to the Decision of the CONTRiCTING PiARTIES of 28 March 1966, iustralia introduced a system of tariff preferences for developing countries on the manufactures, semi-manufactures and handicraft products listed in the annex to that Decision. On 12 April 1966 provision for unlimited duty-free admission of the handicraft products concerned was introduced. On the same day, importers were invited to apply for quota certificates for the importation, at preferential tariff rates, of products listed in the annex as being subject to tariff quota control. The quota certificates were to be issued between 1 July and 31 December 1966, and were to cover inports with total f.o.b. values not exceeding half the level of each annual tariff quota provided for in the annex. Importers to whom certificates were issued were perinitted to import the products concerrid at any time within twelve months from 1 July I966.
2. On 19 September 1966, applications were invited for guota certificates to be issued during the second half of the first quota year for preferential imports up to the value of the remaining half of each annual quota provided for in the annex, plus any unallocated portion of the quota made available during the first half of the quota year. Importers to whon allocations were made were permitted to import the products concerned at any time within twelve months fron I January 1967.
3. In the same way, invitations have been extended to inporters before the beginning of each subsequent half year. In each cese, however, accuunt has been taken of the reductions in developing country preferential tariff rates, the increases in preferential teriff quotas and the new tariff preferences which have bcon made effective upon completion of the notification and consultation procedures laid down in the Decision. The relevant notifications are those which were circulated in documents $L / 2793$ of 19 May 1967; I/2793/idd. 1 of 15 June 1967; L/ 2832 of 7 iusust 1967; L/2922 of 22 November 1967; L/2971 of 2 February 1968; L/2974 of 14 Fobruary 1968; L/2982 of 26 February 1968; L/3038 of 5 July 1968; L/3061 of 28 . Lugust 1968; L/3163 of 10 January 1969; L/ 3223 of 25 Junc 1969; L/3266 of 12 Novenber 1969; L/3372 of 12 March 1970; and L/3423 of 7 fiugust 1970. The total value of the quotas available hes thus been progressively increased uritil at the prosent time, it stands at \% $\$ 47 \mathrm{milli}$ on per annum, compared with the initial totel of $\$$ idditionally, the range of handicraft produns admissible at the preferential dutyfree rate has been incrcased considerably. In all cnses the goods concerned havo been nominated by developine countries as being of export interest to them.
4. IIl allocations of quota are mede without discrimination between applicant importers or cligiblc cuuntries of origin.
5. Paragraphs 4 and 5 of the Decision of the CONTRLCTING PLRTIES provide for consultations. with any contracting party which considers that action taken or propused by iustralia under the Decision is causing or threatons substantial injury to its trade with iustralia in the relevant goods. Tk: only such requests so far received have been two fron the Uaited Kingdom win behalf uf Hong Konj. In cach case the request concerned the cxclusion of Hong Kone fron particular preferences. Contracting partics. were advised of the outcone of the consultations in ducuments L/2832 and L/2971.
6. Linnexed to this report arc tebles of statistics on the ellocation of preferential tariff quotes and on inport clearances, from all sources, of products of the type to which the preferential ciuotas apply. The tables cover the fouryear period 1966/67 to 1969/70, in respect of quota allocations and the three-year periud 1967/68 to 1969/70 in respect of inport clearances. In the case of import clearances, statistics for the yoar preceding the introduction of each new group of preferential tariff quotas heve been included for purposes of comparison.
7. innex is shows the total value of allocetions made during each of the fiscal years involved, in respect of each of the preferential tariff quitas in foree at the tine. innex $B$ shows the tutal allocations for each of the developing countries nominated by applicent inporturs as the intended source of supply. innex $C$ shows the f.o.b. velue of imports actually cleared under the tariff.item(s) to: which each quota applied. fanex $D$ shows the extent to which individual countries woru supplicrs of inports adiltted at the develuping country proforontial tariff rates.
8. In the colum heeded viouta Grupi in innexes is and $C$, the teriff iten shown in each case is aither the itom to which e separete quota applies or, if more than one iten shares a single quota, the first of the group of items sharing the quota. The figures which appear opposite eech of the tariff-itens shown, however, represent the tutals of the sllocetions or clearencos applicable to the item or ittus to which oach queta npplies.
9. The statistics rolate only to preferencus which were effectivo on 30 June 1970. They do not include, for instance, the changes notificd in docuients L/3372 of 12 March 1970, and L/3423 of 7 Lugust 1970.
10. It will be suen thet for the period covered by tho statistics, both quuta allocations and irpurt clurancus at the special preferential rates availablo have been incresing rapidiy. It is also evidont, however, thet there remains considcrable scupe fur doveluping countries to take grentor advantaje of the opportunities provided by the syster.
11. As stated in the lest anaual roport, all requests for the inclusion of further products within the systen heve been or are being carefully considered.
