EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES - EMERGENCY ACTION ON CERTAIN BOVINE MEAT

Addendum

The following communication, dated 27 October 1975, has been received from the Commission of the European Communities.

I have the honour to advise you, for the information of the Contracting Parties of the new improvements made by the Community as of 1 October 1975 in the special provisions concerning meat imports laid down under the "EXIM" procedure by Regulation (EEC) No. 1090/75.

These provisions, now embodied in Regulation (EEC) No. 2477/75 of 29 September 1975 and applicable as from 1 October 1975, provide that from now on two applications for import licences may be submitted for each export operation without refund. This means that operators may import two tons of meat for each ton exported under this heading.

The Regulation also enables applications for import licences to be submitted twice a month.

In addition, and in the spirit underlying the adoption of Regulations (EEC) No. 1208/75 and 1209/75, the Commission has adopted Regulation (EEC) No. 2475/75 under which, as from 1 October 1975, import licences may be issued for certain young male bovine animals of highland breeds, subject to an overall monthly limit of 5,000 head. In addition, the Commission has adopted Regulation (EEC) No. 2476/75 under which, as of 1 October 1975, there shall be issued import licences for 30,000 head of calves and young male bovine animals for fattening.
