ASSOCIATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE EUROPEAN ECONOMIC COMMUNITY AND MALTA

The following communication has been received by the parties to the Agreement.

COVERING NOTE CONCERNING THE COMMUNICATION ADDRESSED BY THE PARTIES TO THE AGREEMENT TO THE CONTRACTING PARTIES TO GATT

SECURE OF CHES SPECIFIC OR SHE CREATER CT.

At a meeting of the Council on 21 April 1971, the representatives of the European Community and of Malta informed the CONTRACTING PARTIES of the Agreement concluded by them on 5 December 1970 (C/M/68). The Council then decided to set up a Working Party to examine the Agreement in the light of the relevant provisions of the General Agreement. The Working Party met on 9 and 24 February 1972 and presented its report to the Council (L/3665 of 1 March 1972).

The text of the Agreement, which entered into force on 1 April 1971, is contained in document L/3512. The questions addressed to the parties to the Agreement, as well as the replies thereto, are contained in L/3639.

THE EUROPEAN ECONOMIC COMMUNITY AND NALTA

Communication Addressed by the Parties

to the Agreement to the CONTRACTING PARTIES to GATT

- 1. The achievement of the progressive elimination of obstacles with respect to substantially all the trade between the Community and Malta has proceeded in accordance with the provisions of the Agreement since its entry into force on 1 April 1971.
- 2. In conformity with said Agreement, imports of industrial products originating in Malta are admitted into the Community without quantitative restrictions.

Since the entry into force of the Agreement, substantially all imports into the Community of industrial products from Malta enjoy a 70 per cent tariff reduction which should culminate into full exemption as from the beginning of the second stage.

- 3. Malta, for its part, applies tariff reductions of 25 per cent since 1 April 1974 (as against 15 per cent as of the date of the entry into force of the Agreement), in respect of imports originating in the Community, such reduction to reach 35 per cent as from the beginning of the fifth year.
- 4. An analysis of the statistical elements set forth in the annexed table, concerning the evolution of Malta's external trade in recent years shows that in the period of implementation of the Agreement (1972 in relation to 1970), Malta's imports from the Community as originally composed have increased by 27 per cent, while Malta's exports to the Community have increased by 122 per cent.
