GENERAL AGREEMENT ON TARIFFS AND TRADE

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GENERALIZED SYSTEM OF PREFERENCES

Notification by Hungary

With reference to the Decision of 25 June 1971 of the CONTRACTING PARTIES, the. Permanent Mission of the Hungarian People's Republic has provided the following information on improvements in the preferential tariff system of Hungary which entered into effect on 1 January 1974.

As a result of these improvements, the preferential tariff rates have been reduced in an autonomous way for products the import of which has been considerably increased from the beneficiary countries since the implementation of the preferential system, and with regard to products in respect of which the most-favoured-nation tariff rates have been decreased in the meantime. The product coverage of the system has also been broadened with a view to including products the import of which would probably increase as a result of preferential treatment (see Annex 1). The new preferential tariffs are stipulated in joint decrees of the Minister of Foreign Trade and Minister of Finance - Nos. 8/1973/XII.29/KKM-PM and 4/1974/VIII.24/KKM-PM.

The number of beneficiary countries has been enlarged on the basis of the communications received from developing countries in which the application of non-discriminatory treatment to products of Hungarian origin was specifically mentioned. At present, preferential treatment is being applied to eighty-two countries (see Annex 2). The list of beneficiary countries is included in Decree of the Minister of Foreign Trade - No. 7/1973/XII.19/KKM. The criteria for giving preferential treatment remain those detailed in the original notification. 1

The text of the communication of the Special Representative of the Hungarian Government to International Economic Organizations, dated 4 November 1971, on the implementation of the Hungarian preferential tariff system and of the decrees on the subject, is set out in Annex 3.

ANNEX 3

Communication of the Special Representative of the Hungarian
Government to International Economic Organizations

Dated 4 November 1971 on the Implementation of
the Hungarian Preferential Tariff System
and the Decrees on the Subject

"... In pursuance of the eighth general principle of Part II, Chapter I of the Final Act adopted at the first session of the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development held in 1964 in Geneva; in conformity with resolution 15 (II), paragraph II/3 adopted at the second session of the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development in 1968 in New Delhi, and furthermore in implementation of the Agreed Conclusions adopted by common agreement in the Special Committee on Preferences, the Government of the Hungarian People's Republic has elaborated and adopted a system of preferential tariff treatment of goods originating in the developing countries. By implementing the above-mentioned resolution of UNCTAD, the Government of the Hungarian People's Republic wishes to contribute also to the attainment of the objectives of resolution 21 (II) of UNCTAD in accordance with the joint declaration made by five socialist countries of Eastern Europe in the Special Committee on Preferences.

The Hungarian People's Republic shall present a positive list of products to which it intends to accord preferential tariff treatment. This list covers groups of products, both agricultural and industrial, falling within 584 tariff numbers and sub-numbers. The Hungarian preferential list of products has been prepared on the basis of the lists of requests of developing countries and includes items in which the least developed among the developing countries have an export interest.

Extent of tariff reductions

The preferential tariff rates to be applied to goods originating in developing countries are contained in Decree No. 26/1971/X.2. issued by the Government of the Hungarian People's Republic on 12 August 1971. The above decree has been published in the official journal of the Hungarian People's Republic, <u>Hungarian Official Gazette</u>, issue 67/1971.

As a first step approximately 100 export products of developing countries will be accorded full exemption from duty in the Hungarian market. For other products the preferential tariff rates will be 50 to 90 per cent below the most-favoured-nation tariff rates.

Beneficiary countries

The countries which will be accorded preferential tariff treatment in the customs territory of the Hungarian People's Republic will be those developing countries in Asia, Africa and Latin America whose per capita national income is less than Hungary's; which do not apply discrimination against Hungary; which maintain normal trade relations with Hungary and can give reliable evidence of the origin of products eligible for preferential tariff treatment.

Regulation concerning origin

According to Hungarian procedures, a product shall be deemed to originate in a beneficiary country if it has been produced in that country or if 50 per cent of its value has been added to it in that country.

Safeguard mechanism

According to Decree No. 48/1967. /XI.19./ section 3, paragraph 1/c of the Hungarian Government, the Minister of Foreign Trade and the Minister of Finance, in collaboration with the President of the National Board for Materials and Prices, are authorized to increase or reduce for a determined period the tariff rates established in Columns I, II and III of the Commercial Customs Tariff, or the tariff rates for individual goods, or to suspend provisionally their application.

Entry into force, regulations concerning validity

The preferential customs tariff of the Hungarian People's Republic enters into force on 1 January 1972.

Columns I and II of the Customs Tariff indicate "preferential" and "most-favoured-nation" tariff rates, respectively. The tariff rates in Column III are applied to goods originating from those countries to which neither preferential nor m.f.n. treatment is applied (see L/3301, page 26 for details).

The goods of developing countries which on 1 January 1972 extend special (reverse) preferences to certain developed countries will be accorded preferential tariff treatment by the Government of the Hungarian People's Republic only provisionally, until further decision by the Hungarian Minister of Foreign Trade, on the assumption that these developing countries will eliminate such special (reverse) preferences not later than 31 December 1975 in accordance with the relevant resolutions of UNCTAD.

The preferential tariff rates shall be valid only for goods imported through foreign trade channels."

The rates of Column I (preferential tariffs) of the Commercial Customs Tariff published under Article 5 of the Government Decree No. 48 of 1967 (18.XI.) are established in the Annex to this Decree.

Article 2

The text of the Commercial Customs Tariff and the rates of tariffs of Column II. and III. shall be amended in accordance with the Annex to this Decree.

Article 3

The present Decree shall enter into force on 1 January 1972. At the same time the amendments for tariff numbers 03.01, 03.02, 07.01, 07.03, 08.01, 08.05, 09.04, 15.12, 20.02, 41.04, 44.18, 48.07, 73.36, 84.51, 41.02 contained in Annex No. 4 to the Joint Decree of the Ministers of Foreign Trade and Finance No. 5 of 1970 (20.XII) shall cease to have effect.

Direct imports shall be certified by the import licences which must be presented for customs clearance.

Article 3

The Order No. 9 of 1971(Kk.E.19.)KKM of the Minister of Foreign Trade (hereinafter referred to as U) which implements - in agreement with the Minister of Finance - certain provisions affecting foreign trade exchanges and the licensing authority of the Ministry of Foreign Trade included in Joint Decree No. 4 of 1967 (23.XII.) of the Ministers of Finance and Foreign Trade respectively (hereinafter referred to as R), regarding the detailed rules of customs legislation and the regulation of customs procedure, as amended by Joint Decree No. 23 of 1969 (15.VII.) as well as by Joint Decree No. 20 of 1971 (7.V.) of the Ministers of Finance and Foreign Trade respectively, shall be supplemented as follows:

Article 1

After Article 4 of U, the following shall be inserted as Article 4(a): *

Article 4(a)

ad Article 33, para. (3) of R:

- (1) The origin of dutiable goods originating in countries enumerated in Decree No. 3 of 1971 (30 Dec.) KKM of the Minister of Foreign Trade, whose customs value exceed 50,000 forints, and whose customs clearance for home use is effected by the application of the duty rates in Column I of the Commercial Customs Tariff, shall be certified according to the provisions of paragraphs (2) and (3) below.
- (2) As certificate of origin shall be accepted the certificate of origin according to the attached form, filled in by the exporter of the country of origin (in any language, by machine or hand in this case in ink and block letters, without correction, or if there is any correction, it should be duly confirmed) and certified by the competent authority of the exporting country. In box 8 of the certificate of origin either indication "P" shall be given (denoting that the goods were wholly produced in the country of exportation) or alternatively indication "Y" followed by a value in percentage not more than 50 per cent (indicating that the value of imported materials or components used for the manufacture of the export product does not exceed 50 per cent of the latter's value).
- (3) The certificate of origin of the goods shall be presented in duplicate for customs clearance purposes.
- (4) Dutiable goods for which no certificate of origin has been presented for customs clearance purposes cannot qualify for clearance by applying the duty rates in Column I of the Commercial Customs Tariff.

Article 2

This Order shall enter into effect on 1 January 1972.
