AGREEMENTS BETWEEN THE EUROPE N COMMUNITIES

The following communication has been received from the Government of Norway.

With reference to Article 4 in the trade agreement between Norway and the European Economic Community, the Norwegian Government hereby notifies that as from 24 October 1975, Norway has abolished customs duties for products originating from the member countries of EEC and EFTA as concerns the following tariff headings inthe Norwegian Customs Tariff.

The internal tax on cars has at the same time been increased in order to compensate the loss of State revenue caused by the abolition of the customs duties.
