I refer to your letter of 29 February of this year (ref. MP RE 1108) transmitting a letter from the Chairman of the Textiles Surveillance Body inviting countries participating in the Multifibre Arrangement (MFA) to update information on restrictions introduced or maintained on textile products.

In this connection, the Ministry of External Trade wishes to state that Resolution No. 1058 published in the Official Gazette of 1 September 1983, volume 280, as made effective by Resolution No. 1335 of the Ministry of Economic and Financial Affairs published in the Official Gazette of 24 December 1983, implicitly revoked the import prohibition on certain products that had been introduced by Resolution No. 343 of 1 April 1982 (originally the Import Prohibition Resolution No. 927 of 6 November 1980) which covered, inter alia, a broad range of textile products.

This means that at the present time El Salvador is imposing no restrictions on textile imports.
