ARRANGEMENT REGARDING INTERNATIONAL TRADE IN TEXTILES

Notification under Article 4:4

Modification of the Bilateral Agreement between the United States and Singapore

The Textiles Surveillance Body has received a notification from the United States of a further modification to its bilateral agreement with Singapore, concluded under Article 4 of the MFA. A designated consultation level was agreed for Category 636, and 1985 consultation levels were agreed for Categories 331, 336, 337, 359, 631, 637 and 640.

The TSB, pursuant to its procedures regarding bilateral agreements notified under Article 4, has examined the relevant documentation and is forwarding the text of the notification to participating countries for their information.

UNITED STATES AND SINGAPORE AMEND BILATERAL TEXTILE AGREEMENT

The United States and Singapore exchanged letters in Washington, dated 20 May and 18 June 1985, respectively, to effect amendment of their bilateral textile agreement. Texts of the letters follow:

I am writing in reference to paragraph 5 of the Agreement between the United States and Singapore relating to trade in cotton, wool and man-made fibre textiles and textile products, with annexes, effected by exchange of notes on 21 August 1981, as amended (the Agreement), and to your Government's request of 20 May 1985.

On behalf of my Government, I agree to your proposal that the 1985 consultation level for Category 636 be set at 40,000 dozen. It is the understanding of my Government that your letter of 20 May and this reply constitute an amendment to the Agreement.
