1. Registered Exporters are permitted to obtain Import Replenishment(IREP) licences which are valid for importation from any sources of limited permissible items, restricted items and canalised items necessary for the production of the particular export products.
2. India's import restrictions on textiles, along with restrictions on other imports are maintained for balance of payments, reasons. Details of various measures are described in the Import Policy of India published once in three years by the Department of Commerce, Government of India.
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
