Sir,

Pursuant to the commitment undertaken by the Government of Costa Rica when acceding to the Multifibre Arrangement, to provide information on current restrictions in our country on imports of textiles products, I have the pleasure to inform you that there are no non-tariff obstacles or restrictions on imports of such products.

The following taxes are applied to imports:

- The Central American Import Tariff, calculated on an <u>ad valorem</u> basis at a rate ranging from 5 per cent to 65 per cent; the 5 per cent rate applies to raw materials not produced in Central America, and the 65 per cent rate to made-up articles and garments.
- l per cent tax on customs value.
- 2 per cent import surcharge (applicable to all products).

With regard to woven fabrics of jute and of other vegetable fibres, a 20 per cent surcharge is applied which will be progressively reduced by 2 per cent every six months until it is totally eliminated in 1992.
