ARRANGEMENT REGARDING INTERNATIONAL TRADE IN TEXTILES

Notification under Article 2:4

Status of Restrictions Maintained on Imports Of Textiles and Textile Products

China

The Textiles Surveillance Body received a communication from China concerning restrictions maintained by it on imports of textile products. This communication was submitted under Article 2, paragraph 4, of the Arrangement.

After its review, 2 the TSE noted that the notification added no new information and felt, as it did on the occasion of its previous reviews of China's notifications, that it still was not able to determine whether or not all restrictions maintained by China were in conformity with the Arrangement.

It decided, nevertheless, to transmit this notification to participating countries, for their information. The TSB understood that the decision to transmit the notification to the Textiles Committee was without prejudice to the completion of its review of China's notifications under Article 2:4 and to the ongoing consultations in the Working Party on China's status as a contracting party.

The two previous notifications referred to in the communication are contained in COM.TEX/SB/1392 and 1430.

The review was made according to the procedures for participating countries which have acceded to the MFA under Article 13:2 (COM.TEX/S3/27, Annex).
