Dear Mr. Raffaelli,

With reference to your note dated 3 August 1992, I wish to inform you that the Argentine Republic does not apply the restrictions on imports of textile products provided for by the Multi-fibre Arrangement.

The only non-tariff restriction that exists in the Argentine Republic in connection with textile imports concerns the suspension of imports of used clothing, pursuant to Ministry of Industry and Foreign Trade Resolutions Nos. 1646/91 and 696/92.

It should also be mentioned that, after dumping was found to exist, preventive anti-dumping measures were recently taken with respect to imports of polyester-cotton shirting originating in the People's Republic of China.

This preventive measure was provided for by the Ministry of Industry and Foreign Trade Resolution 193/92.
