## ADMINISTRATIVE AND FINANCIAL QUESTIONS

## Finai Position of the 1992 Budget

1. In accordance with the CONTRACTING PARTIES' standing instructions regarding reporting on the results at the end of the financial period, the Director-Genera''s proposals for dealing with any savings or deficits, the financial position concerning the transfer of credits between sections of the budget and any advances made from the Working Capital Fund, the Director-General submits the following information.

## I. EXPENDITURE BUDGET

2. The CONTRACTING PARTIES appropriated Sw F 85,973,327 for the Einancial year 1992. Total obligations incurred in 1992 amounted to $S w \mathrm{~F} 83,452,619$ leaving an unencumbered balance of Sw F 2,520,708, which is the net result of savings of Sw F 2,921,927 plus Sw F 100,000 for Unforeseen Expenditure as detailed in paragraphs 3 to 12, reduced by the excess expenditure of Sw $\bar{F} 501,219$ referred to in paragraphs 13 to 16 below.
3. Savings occursed on the following sections: Sw F

4. Under Section 2 (Mectings of the Council and other meetings), the savings resulted mainly from a zeduced requirement for freelance interpreters.
5. Under Section 3 (Salaries), the savings resulted mainly from the salary increases being lower than anticipated (for the General Service staff, the increase was $4.09 \%$ against 5\%; for Professionals, the increase was less than the one class of Post Adjustment budgeted. There were also savings as a result of differences in the exchange rate (the 1992 budget was based on US\$1/Sw F 1.47 whereas the average rate over the year was US\$1/Sw F 1.40). Savings occurred also as some posts were vacant and/or filled at a lower level during the year.
6. Under Section 4 (Common Starf Costs), the major savings were under the Contributions to the United Nations Joint Staff Pension Fund sub-item due to a lower than buyececi exchange rate and to vacant posts. There were also savings in the siciness insurance, installation grants, travel on home leave (as some staff postponed their travol to 1993) and separation payments (as some contrects of staff were extended in 1993) sub-items. There was over-expenditure in the family allowances, travel and removal expenses, repatriation grants and education grants and travel sub-items. In respect for the over-expenditure, staff entitlements were in the event greater than had been originally foreseen.
7. Under Section 8 (Printing), the savings were due mainly to the fact that the 1992 edition of "International Trade" was limited to its statistical part.
8. Under Section 9 (Representation and Hospitality), the savings resulted from the unused portion of the credit allotted to the post of Deputy Director-General which was vacant for the entire year.
9. Under Section 12 (Trade Policy Training Courses), savings resulted from a host government paying the travel costs associated with the study tour to its country.
10. Under Section 13 (Uruguay Round) and Section 14 (Trade Policy Review Mechanism), the savings were the result of over and under-expenditures on various sub-items. Major savings were realized under salaries for temporary assistance and the UNJS Pension Fund contributions due to a lower rate of exchange and posts being vacant, as well as other Common Staff costs related to these posts. Over-expenditures occurred on installation grants, separation payments, official and technical co-operation missions and communications costs.
11. The provision under Section 16 (Unforeseen Expenditure) was not used.
12. Under Section 17 (International Trade Centre UNCTAD/GATT), savings resulted from an average exchange rate of the year of US\$1/Sw F 1.40 as opposed to the budgeted rate of US\$1/Sw F 1.47 .
13. Over expenditure of Sw F 501,219 against the approved appropriations was incurred under the following sections:

14. Under Section 5 (Missions), over-expenditure resulted from the need for technical cooperation and political level visits being greater than anticipated, due to the changing circumstances of the Uruguay Round.
15. Under Section 6 (Dispute Settlement Panels), more panels were established than had been anticipated.
16. Under Section 7 (Common Services) there was over or under-expenditure on various sub-items. The main over-expenditure was on electronic data processing equipment, communications (unforeseen increases in local telephone costs) and the result of incresses in insurance premiums. There were partly compensating savings under the contractual cleaning, books and information material, water and maintenance of service cars sub-items.

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17. Transfers between budgetary sections of Sw F 501,219 are necessary in order to cover excess expenditure over approved appropriations on the sections mentioned in paragraph 13 by savings on other sections. Authority is sought to increase these appropriations accordingly. as follows:

18. In connection with Section 18 (Restitution of 1990 Deficit), authority was granted in the context of the approved 1992 budget to consider the 1990 over-expenditure of Sw F 261,327 under paragraph (iii) (b) of the Rules Governing the Use of the Working Capital Fund (document Spec(86)6/Rev.1) and this amount was withdrawn from the Fund. Consequently, the corresponding advance was reimbursed to the Fund by including this credit in the 1992 budget.

## II. INCOME BUDGET

19. Amounts totalling Sw F 85,906,175 were credited as budgetary income in 1.992, which fell short of the approved estimate by Sw F 67.152 .


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20. Net miscellaneous income fell short against the astimated figure by Sw F 117,912, details of which are outlined below:

21. As shown in Annex $A$, at 31 December 1992, the total contributions in arrears from contracting parties amounted to Sw F 22,083,678, of which Sw F 4,919,905 represented the arrears for the year 1992.

## III. SURPLUS ACCOUNT

22. The Surplus Account, reproduced in Annex B, shows an accunulated deficit of Sw F 934,208 at 31 December 1992, due to:
(a) the negative opening balance as at 1 January 1992: Sw F 142,577;
(b) the repayment to the Working Capital Fund in respect of 1991 deficit: Sw F 4,892,759;
(c) the writing-off of irrecoverable debts: Sw F 3,293, and
(d) the shortfall of actual miscellaneous income over estimated miscellaneous income: Sw F 117,912.

This was offset by:
(a) the restitution of the 1990 deficit: Sw F 261,327;
(b) a decrease in the provision for contributions in arrears: Sw F 1,389,538;
(c) assessments on contracting parties subsequent to the adoption of the 1992 scale of contributions: Sw F 50,760, and
(d) a budgetary surplus for 1992: Sw F 2,520,708.
23. The accumulated deficit of $S w=934,208$ was covered by a transfer from the Working Capital Fund.

## IV. EARLY PAYMENI ENCOURAGEMENT SCHEME

24. Pursuant to the Council's approval (C/M/226) of the Budget Committee's recommendation (L/6384) to introduce a system to encourage payment of contributions, interest earned on the current year's contributions refunded to contracting parties on the basis of calculations which take account of the amount and date of payment. Annex $C$ shows the apportionment of the amount of Sw F 70\&,754 earned as interest in 1992. The apportioned amounts will be deducted from the relevant contracting parties, assessed contributions for 1994.

## V. WORKING CADI AL FUND

25. In accordance with the authority contained in document $L / 756$, paragraph 10, of 27 November 1957, which stipulates that subsequent receipts of outstanding contributions are to be credited to the Working Capital Fund to the extent necessary to reimburse the advance made, Sw $\mathrm{F} 4,892,759$ was repaid to the Working Capital Fund in respect of the advance made in 1991. With the interest of Sw F 374,131 credited to it, the principal of the Fund at 31 December 1992 amounted to Sw F 5,361,326. Of this amount, Sw F 934,208 were transferred to offset the accumulated deficit.
