The Ozone-depleting Substances Regulations No. 3 are being amended to incorporate this directive. The products which will be subject to this ban are:</li> <li>Mobile air conditioning units;</li> <li>refrigeration, air conditioning and heat pump equipment;</li> <li>non-medical aerosols (note that aerosols for non-essential uses have been banned in Canada since 1989);</li> <li>insulation boards and pipe covers; and</li> <li>prepolymers.</li> </ul>
