5.	Title and number of pages of the notified document: Proposed Amendment to the Food and Drug Regulations
6.	<p>Description of content: To ensure public health and safety, the Health Protection Branch establishes Maximum Residue Limits (MRLs) for agricultural chemicals based on scientifically developed acceptable daily intakes (ADIs). The safety assessments of pesticide residues in food are based on the critical review of all scientific data available, calculating the theoretical daily intake of a residue and comparing this to the ADI as determined by extensive test results and the application of an appropriate safety factor.</p> <p>After a review of all available data, it is apparent that residues of fenoxaprop-ethyl in all treated crops would be covered by the general residue limit of 0.1 ppm as specified in subsection B.15.002 (1) of the Food and Drug Regulations. However, because of the possible feeding of treated forage or crops to livestock, an MRL of 0.02 ppm in milk is proposed.</p>
