ARRANGEMENT REGARDING INTERNATIONAL TRADE IN TEXTILES

Notification transmitted under Articles 7 and 8

Bilateral Agreement between Canada and Lesotho

The Textiles Surveillance Body received a notification under Article 4 from Canada of an agreement concluded with Lesotho for the period 1 January 1993 to 31 December 1994.

The TSB decided to transmit the notification to participating countries under Articles 7 and 8, as Lesotho had not as yet accepted the 1993 Protocol maintaining in force the Arrangement.¹

Canada-Lesotho Textile Products Consultations Agreed Record of Discussions

- 1. Delegations representing the Government of Canada and the Government of the Kingdom of Lesotho met on 12 and 13 May 1993, in London, to discuss the export from Lesotho of pants (Category 5) for import into Canada.
- 2. The two delegations had detailed discussions on the level of the quota restraint on pants from Lesotho into Canada. They were able to reach agreement, ad referendum, on the establishment of a bilateral agreement as set out in the attached Memorandum of Understanding between Canada and the Government of Lesotho ("the MOU").
- 3. They agreed that effective 1 January 1993, the MOU and the attached documents entitled "Annex I Restraint Levels", "Annex II Preamble Lesotho", and "Annex II Clothing Categories Lesotho", will represent the structure of restraints on imports of pants into Canada from Lesotho to one based on the Harmonized System (HS).
- 4. Delegations further agreed that in administering the MOU Lesotho authorities would endeavour to respect any commitments already entered into by Canadian importers and exporters in Lesotho with each other.
- 5. They also agreed that the authorities of Lesotho would inform Canadian authorities of the date on which Lesotho's system for administering the MOU would come into effect, and that, for their part, the Canadian authorities, upon receipt of this information, would provide data to the Lesotho authorities on the volume of exports of restrained products from Lesotho to Canada during the interim period between 1 January 1993 and the date on which the Lesotho administrative system commences. The Lesotho delegation undertook that these volumes would be debited from the 1993 restraint level indicated in the MOU.
- 6. With respect to the exchange of statistics under Paragraph 14 of the MOU, it was agreed that the responsible authorities would be, for Lesotho, the Ministry of Trade and Industry and, for Canada, the Department of External Affairs.
- 7. The delegations agreed that their respective authorities would communicate to each other their responses to this ad referendum agreement at an early opportunity.

London, England 13 May 1993 Memorandum of Understanding between the Government of Canada and the Government of the Kingdom of Lesotho relating to the export from Lesotho of certain textile products for import into Canada.

Introduction

1. This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) sets out the arrangements that have been agreed upon between the Governments of Canada and Lesotho regarding the export of certain textile products from Lesotho for import into Canada.

Coverage

2. The categories of products which are subject to restraint under this Agreement are indicated in Annex I hereto. For the purpose of classifying textile products in the appropriate category the definitions and notes set out in Category 5 of Annex II hereto will apply.

Duration

3. These restraints will apply for the period commencing on 1 January 1993 and ending on 31 December 1994.

Restraint Levels

4. Except as provided for in paragraphs 11 to 13 below (Carryover/Carry Forward), the Government of Lesotho will restrain its exports to Canada of the textile products described in Category 5 of Annex II commencing 1 January 1993 to the limits specified in column (C) of Annex I.

Administration

- 5. These arrangements will be implemented on the basis of export control system operated by the Government of Lesotho. Exports of the textile products described in Category 5 of Annex II and subject to a specific quantitative limit in Annex I will be covered by an original copy of an "Export Certificate" endorsed and issued by the Ministry of Trade and Industry of Lesotho to the effect that the goods covered by the export certificate have been debited to the applicable quantitative limit as set out in Annex I.
- 6. For the purpose of implementing these arrangements, the date of export from Lesotho will be used to determine the restraint period in which any shipments of textile products will be counted.
- 7. The Government of Lesotho will endeavour to ensure that exports to Canada of all textile products which are listed in Category 5 of Annex II and subject to restraint levels as per Annex I are spaced out as evenly as possible during each restraint period, due account being taken of seasonal factors and of normal channels of trade.
- 8. Export certificates issued by the Government of Lesotho in respect of textile products subject to restraint levels as specified in Annex I of this Arrangement will contain the following information:
 - 1. Country of destination;
 - 2. Country of origin;
 - 3. Certificate number;
 - 4. Importer's name and address;
 - 5. Exporters' name and address;

- 6. Item number and description of product as set out in Annex I of the MOU:
- 7. Quantity expressed in the units as designated in Annex I of the MOU;
- 8. F.O.B. or C.I.F. value except for non-commercial consignments;
- 9. Certification by the Ministry of Trade and Industry that the quantity has been debited against the agreed restraint limit for exports to Canada.
- 9. In the event any quantity covered by an export certificate is not shipped, the Government of Lesotho will notify the Government of Canada of such quantity which may be credited by the Government of Lesotho to the appropriate restraint limit.
- 10. If, on the basis of export data provided by the Government of Lesotho, it is determined that there is a sharp and substantial increase in the concentration of exports, other than a concentration attributable to normal seasonal factors, of particular products in any category subject to quantitative limits, the Government of Lesotho will enter into consultations or correspondence, on request, in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 22 below with a view to remedying this situation.

Carryover/Carry Forward

- 11. Following notification to the Government of Canada of the quantities involved, portions of any quantitative limit set out in Annex I which are not used during the annual restraint period may be carried over and added to the corresponding quantitative limit for the following annual restraint period. The restraint limit for any such restraint period will be increased with the higher percentage limit set out in column (F) of Annex I.
- 12. Following notification to the Government of Canada of the quantities involved, any restraint limit may be increased within the lower percentage limit set out in column (F) of Annex I by a quantity advanced from the corresponding restraint limit for the following annual restraint period. The restraint limit for any such following restraint period will be reduced by a quantity equal to the quantity so advanced.
- 13. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the carryover/carry forward provisions may be used in combination only up to the higher percentage limit set out in column (F) of Annex I.

Exchange of Statistics

- 14. The Government of Lesotho will provide the Government of Canada with monthly statistical reports relating to exports of textile products described in Category 5 of Annex II, certified for export to Canada and debited to the quantitative limits for each restraint period as per Annex I. The Government of Lesotho will also provide, if requested, information on in its exports of textiles and textile products not covered herein.
- 15. In providing the monthly statistics mentioned in paragraph 14, the Government of Lesothe undertakes to include the following information:
 - a. Item and description of goods as set out in Annex I;
 - b. The restraint limit for the restraint period;
 - c. Total quantity issued for the restraint period to date in the units designated in Annex I;
 - d. Notification of any utilization of carryover or carry forward provisions and the quantities involved as provided for in paragraphs 11 to 13 above.

This information should be provided as soon as possible following the end of each month.

- 16. The Government of Canada will provide the Government of Lesotho with monthly statistical reports relating to import permits issued for imports originating in Lesotho of textile products listed in Annex I. In addition, the Government of Canada will provide the Government of Lesotho with monthly statistics of total imports and imports from other significant suppliers in respect of textile products itemized as in Annex I.
- 17. Both Governments reserve the option of requesting, should it be necessary, more specific and detailed information.
- 18. Both Governments will exchange such statistical data relating to exports of textile products not subject to these arrangements as may reasonably be required.

Re-Exports

19. The Government of Canada will, so far as possible, inform the Government of Lesotho when imports into Canada of textile products subject to these arrangement are subsequently re-exported from Canada. Where such re-exports have originally been debited by the Government of Lesotho to quantitative limits, the Government of Lesotho may then credit back the quantity involved to the appropriate quantitative limits.

Consultations

20. The Government of Lesotho and the Government of Canada express their willingness to consult, on request, on any matter arising from the implementation or operation of this Memorandum of Understanding or on any matter germane thereto.

Annexes

21. The Annexes and notes to this Memorandum of Understanding will be considered as an integral part thereof.

Transitional Arrangements

22. The Government of Lesotho and the Government of Canada express their willingness to consult, on request, regarding any difficulties that may arise as a consequence of the establishment of restraints as per the period covered by this Memorandum of Understanding.

ANNEX II - PREAMBLE

- 1. Unless otherwise indicated, gender means garments for men (M), boys (B) (sizes 8 to 18), women (W), girls (G) (sizes 7 to 16), children (C) (sizes 2 to 6X).
- 2. A partially manufactured textile article shall be taken to include an article unfinished or incomplete (including cut or shaped fabric for making such articles), provided that, as presented, the incomplete or unfinished article has the essential character of the complete or finished article. It shall also be taken to include the article presented unassembled or disassembled.
- 3. Garments of indeterminate gender, including unisex garments are to be counted as of female gender.
- 4. Unless otherwise indicated, products covered by restraints under this arrangement are those which predominate by weight of silk, wool, cotton, other vegetable fibres, man-made fibres or other textile materials.
