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## MINIMUM PRICES FOR CEREALS IMPORTED INTO THE UNITED KINGDOM

The following paper has been received from the United Kingdom delegation in connexion with the discussion on item (iv) of document TN.64/Ce/W/l: quality differentials for the various qualities of wheat and coarse grains.

- 1. At the July meeting of the Cereals Group, the United Kingdom undertook to submit for circulation at the next meeting a statement of the minimum import prices for the different qualities of wheat which it had introduced in July 1964. A note is accordingly attached showing these prices in sterling per long ton and in United States dollars per metric ton. The note also shows the minimum import prices for barley, oats, maize and sorghum. All the minimum import prices are fixed on a c.i.f. basis United Kingdom.
- 2. The main factors which the United Kingdom Government took into account in determining the quality differentials for the various categories of wheat for minimum price purposes were:
  - (a) the differentials established in world markets in recent years;
  - (b) the minimum price established under the International Wheat Agreement and records prepared by the Secretariat of the Wheat Council on quality differentials for wheat;
  - (c) the co-efficients of equivalence between the various qualities of wheat established under the European Economic Community regulations.

## Coarse grains

3. In fixing minimum import prices for coarse grains, the United Kingdom took account not only of market differentials in past years but also of the relative feeding values of the various cereals concerned (including denatured wheat) which it considers important in this context. No differentials, however, have been introduced for the different grades of each of the coarse grains.
