PRODUCTS OF SPECIAL INTEREST TO THE EXPORTS OF LESS-DEVELOPED COUNTRIES

Communication from the United Arab Republic

The following communication has been received from the Government of the United Arab Republic:

"Following our statement in the Trade Negotiations Committee, I enclose herewith a list of our products which are of interest to us, and which we hope developed countries will not include in their exceptions lists.

"In this regard we would like to draw your attention to the following:

- (1) We have drawn a single line under items which are included in the three lists approved by Committee III.
- (2) We have drawn a double line under items which are included in the fourth list which is under consideration by Committee III.
- (3) Regarding items to which we would request developed countries to grant more than a 50 per cent cut, we think that it is not possible for us to draw up this list at this stage.
- (4) Some additional items may be added at a later stage.

"We hope that other less-developed countries will submit their lists, so we can formulate a consolidated list of commodities which are of interest to less-developed countries and which we would all like developed countries not to include in their exceptions lists."
