### PRODUCTS OF SPECIAL INTEREST TO EXPORTS OF LESS-DEVELOPED COUNTRIES

#### Communication from the Government of Uruguay

The following communication has been received from the Government of Uruguay.

With reference to airgram GATT/AIR/398 dated 4 June 1964 (the paragraph relating to the Sub-Committee on the Participation of the Less-Developed Countries) as well as document TN.64/31 (paragraph 4), I have pleasure in transmitting the following information regarding products to which my country attaches particular importance in connexion with the Kennedy Round negotiations and which accordingly we would not wish to see included in the exceptions lists of the participating countries.

First of all, I enclose herewith an extract from document Spec(64)99 with the list of items therein of interest to Uruguay.

Furthermore, I should like to request the addition of those products mentioned in document L/1662/Rev.l which are not included in the above-mentioned annex to this letter, as well as the following:

- (a) Meat of animals of the bovine species, salted and jerked beef
- (b) Meat of animals of the bovine species, boned and cooked
- (c) Meat of animals of the ovine species, preserved
- (d) Preserved pork sausages
- (e) Sausages
- (f) Fats and oils for use in industry
- (g) Edible fats and oils
- (h) Dried blood, horsehair and cowhair, fats from bones (ex 15.06 NAB), glues derived from bones, hides, nerves, tendons or from similar products (ex 35.03 NAB), concentrated bile of cows

- (i) Hides and skins of capybara, sea-dog and otter
- (j) Butter
- (k) Cheese
- (1) Precious stones (amethysts and agates), unworked or worked
- (m) Frozen poultry
- (n) Apples and pears
- (o) Tinned fruit and confectionery
- (p) Tinned fish
- (q) Liver meal

We understand that all these products will be subject to the general rules for linear reduction envisaged for the Kennedy Round, in the absence of any decision to the contrary.

As regards the question of which products should be subject to customs duty reductions in excess of 50 per cent, I should like to state that that depends on the charges applied to each item in the various countries, which sometimes vary substantially. Another relevant element of judgment to be taken into account is that often a very marked disparity is found to exist between the duty applicable to a given raw material or foodstuff at the primary processing stage and to the same product when imported after industrial processing.

Clearly, this situation goes against the economic development of the less-developed countries.

In order to arrive at a clearer definition with respect to this subject, it might be of interest to prepare a document carrying on the excellent work set forth in document COM.III/124/Rev.1, which shows the existing customs duties, although only in the ten or fifteen principal markets, with regard to the whole group of products notified by the developing countries. On the basis of a study of this kind, the views expressed by each of the countries could be rationalized. Without prejudice to this, we are in a position to furnish details with respect to Uruguay, while reserving the possibility of adding to them at a later stage and while including only those products which are of definite importance in our external trade.

We request reductions of more than 50 per cent on the following products:

1. Products included in document COM.III/124/Rev.1, listed in the annex to this document

Rice: EEC

Oil-cake: United Kingdom

Tanned hides: EEC, United Kingdom, Sweden, United States and Japan

Combed wool (tops): United Kingdom, United States

Yarn of combed wool: EEC, United Kingdom, Sweden, United States, Japan

Wool cashmere: idem

(Products of animal origin)

Intestines and bones: United Kingdom, United States

Glycerine: Japan

Meat meal: United Kingdom

Glands: United Kingdom, United States, Japan

Casein: EEC, United Kingdom, Japan

Wool, greasy and washed: United States

Woollen yarn: EEC, United Kingdom, Sweden, United States and Japan

#### 2. Products not included in document COM.III/124/Rev.1

Meat of bovine animals, boned and cooked: United States

Meat of bovine animals, frozen and chilled: United Kingdom and EEC

Meat extracts: EEC

Meat of bovine animals, preserved, in general: United States and EEC

With respect to the work of the Sub-Committee on Non-Tariff Barriers, I have pleasure in confirming my note DELEGATT/58/II.1 of 29 May last to the effect that document L/1662/Rev.1 includes elements which are useful in connexion with the request made in airgram 343 (see document TN.64/NTB/16). With respect to those products of interest to Uruguay referred to in the first part of this note and which are not included in the list in L/1662/Rev.1, I consider that the work of the GATT secretariat will enable satisfactory attention to be given to non-tariff barriers which should be studied.

I think it is opportune to emphasize the importance which we attach to this aspect of the Kennedy Round; experience has shown us that for the countries which depend to a great extent on trade in agricultural products, it is essential to make progress in the sector of the removal of non-tariff barriers.
