Communication from Chile

The following communication has been received from the delegation of Chile.

On the instructions of my Government, I have the honour to transmit to you a revised list (annexed) which replaces the provisional list of products¹ attached to my note No. 99, 27 October 1964. This list contains the products which are or might be of special interest to Chile and which my Government would wish to see excluded from the exceptions list in the Kennedy Round. As was the case in the first list, the products underlined in the attached document are those on which my Government would wish a reduction of more than 50 per cent to be made.
