## Presented by Yugoslavia

For the sake of uniformity and ease of reference, the global offer presented by Yugoslavia earlier in the context of the trade negotiations among developing countries, is herewith re-issued in the TN(LDC)N/- series.

## OFFER BY YUGOSLAVIA

Recognizing the importance of mutual exchange of trade preferentials for the promotion of trade among developing countries the Government of the Socialist Federal Republic of Yugoslavia confirms its readiness to enter the negotiations with developing countries which have submitted their request lists to Yugoslavia.

Desiring to contribute to the success of the negotiations, having considered its maximum economic possibilities and taking into account the level of its customs tariff, the Yugoslav Government is ready to participate in the forthcoming negotiations among the developing countries, guided by the following principles:

- (a) In respect of the products originating and shipped from developing countries, except textile products, the Yugoslav Government is ready to negotiate tariff reduction up to 50 per cent of its existing rates of import duties, on the basis of the mutual benefit and taking into account the existing tariff disparities of the countries participating in the negotiations.
- (b) The Yugoslav Government is ready to negotiate the complete elimination of its customs duties lower than 5 per cent in respect of products originating and shipped from developing countries.
- (c) The Yugoslav Government is ready under certain conditions to consider the possibility to negotiate certain items from the textile sector.

In the spirit of the above principles the Yugoslav Government is ready to start the negotiations on the extent of the tariff concessions for particular items covered by the request lists exchanged among developing countries.
